32	SECTION 3. The Committee shall meet upon the joint call of the cochairs. A		
33 24		majority shall constitute a quorum of the Committee, and no official action may be taken except	
34	by a majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present. While in the discharge of its official		



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duties, the Committee shall have the powers under G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through 1 2 G.S. 120-19.4. 3 SECTION 4. Members of the Committee shall receive subsistence and travel 4 expenses as provided in G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate. The Committee may contract for consultants or hire employees in G.S. 120-32.02. The Legislative Services 5 6 Commission, through the Legislative Services Officer, shall assign professional staff to assist the 7 Committee in its work. Upon the direction of the Legislative Services Commission, the 8 Supervisors of Clerks of the Senate and of the House of Representatives shall assign clerical staff 9 to the Committee. 10 SECTION 5. The Committee shall report its findings and recommendations, 11 including any recommended legislation, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Fiscal Research Division no later than March 31, 12 13 2020. The Committee shall terminate upon submission of the report or March 31, 2020, 14 whichever occurs first.

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SECTION 6. This act is effective when it becomes law.
