CHAPTER 1176
HOUSE BILL 925

1 AN ACT TO FIX THE COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEES OF THE GENERAL
2 ASSEMBLY.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:

6 **Section 1.** G.S. 120-33 is amended by striking out all of the said Section after line 7
7 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

8 "The journal clerks, calendar clerks and chief engrossing clerks in each house shall be
9 allowed the sum of seventeen dollars (\$17.00) per day during the Session of the General
10 Assembly and mileage at the rate of 10 cents (10¢) per mile, for one round trip only, from their
11 homes to Raleigh and return. The assistants to the calendar clerk and the assistants to the
12 journal clerk and the clerks to the committees on finance and appropriations of each house and
13 the dispersing clerks and the joint dispersing clerks, the secretary to the Speaker of the House
14 of Representatives, and the secretary to the Lieutenant-Governor shall be allowed the sum of
15 fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per day during the Session of the General Assembly and mileage at the
16 rate of ten cents (10¢) per mile, for one round trip only, from their homes to Raleigh and return.
17 The assistants to the engrossing clerks and all committee clerks and assistants appointed by the
18 Secretary of State to supervise the enrolling of bills and resolutions shall be allowed the sum of
19 thirteen dollars (\$13.00) per day during the Session of the General Assembly and mileage at the
20 rate of ten cents (10¢), for one round trip only, from their homes to Raleigh and return. The
21 chief pages of the House of Representatives and the Senate shall receive the sum of eight
22 dollars (\$8.00) per day during the Session of the General Assembly and mileage at the rate of
23 ten cents (10¢) per mile for one round trip only, from their homes to Raleigh and return. All
24 other pages authorized by either of the two houses shall receive the sum of six dollars and fifty
25 cents (\$6.50) per day during the Session of the General Assembly and mileage at the rate of ten
26 cents (10¢) per mile, for one round trip only, from their homes to Raleigh and return. The
27 chaplain of each house shall be allowed the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) per day and mileage at
28 the rate of ten cents (10¢) per mile, for one round trip only, from his home to Raleigh and
29 return. All laborers and assistants to the Sergeants-at-Arms authorized by law or rules of either
30 the House of Representatives or the Senate shall receive during the Session of the General
31 Assembly the sum of nine dollars (\$9.00) per day and mileage at the rate or ten cents (10¢) per
32 mile, for one round trip only, from their homes to Raleigh and return."

33 **Sec. 2.** All laws and clauses of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.

34 **Sec. 3.** This Act shall be retroactive to the 1st day of February, 1961.

35 **Sec. 4.** This Act shall be in full force from and after its ratification.
