CHAPTER 952
SENATE BILL 52

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE A RETROACTIVE SALARY SUPPLEMENT TO ACADEMIC
2 AND VOCATIONAL TEACHERS, PRINCIPALS, AND SUPERVISORS IN CERTAIN
3 STATE CHILD CARE INSTITUTIONS.

5 WHEREAS, Section 22.1 of Chapter 1053 of the Session Laws of 1959
6 appropriated from the General Fund of the State to the State Board of Education for the purpose
7 of supplementing the salaries of public school academic and vocational teachers, principals,
8 supervisors, and superintendents sums not to exceed seven million fifty-five thousand, nine
9 hundred twenty dollars (\$7,055,920) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1960 and sums not to
10 exceed seven million, two hundred twenty thousand, one hundred forty dollars (\$7,220,140) for
11 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1961, which sums were contingent and would be paid only if
12 General Fund Revenues for each year exceeded the following sums:

13 Fiscal Year 1959-60..... \$238,234,371
14 Fiscal Year 1960-61 \$288,212,955

15 For each one million, four hundred eleven thousand, one hundred eighty-four dollars
16 (\$1,411,184) that General Fund Revenues collected for the year 1959-60 exceeded two hundred
17 eighty-three million, two hundred thirty-four thousand, three hundred seventy-one dollars
18 (\$283,234,371) a one per cent (1%) salary supplement would be paid to the eligible public
19 school personnel employed in the said year; provided, that individual salaries would not be
20 thereby cumulatively supplemented more than five per cent (5%). For each one million, four
21 hundred forty-four thousand twenty-eight dollars (\$1,444,028) that General Fund Revenues
22 collected for the year 1960-61 exceeded two hundred eighty-three million, two hundred twelve
23 thousand, nine hundred fifty-five dollars (\$283,212,955), a one per cent (1%) salary
24 supplement would be paid to the eligible public school personnel employed in the said year;
25 provided, that individual salaries would not be thereby cumulatively supplemented more than
26 five per cent (5%). Percentages would be computed on the basis of 1958-59 base State salary
27 schedules; and

28 WHEREAS, General Fund Revenues for the fiscal year 1959-60 exceeded two
29 hundred eighty-three million, two hundred thirty-four thousand, three hundred seventy-one
30 dollars (\$283,234,371) by twenty-six million, nine hundred seventy-three thousand, two
31 hundred eighty-four dollars (\$26,973,284) and public school academic and vocational teachers,
32 principals, supervisors, and superintendents received from such contingency appropriation a
33 1959-60 salary supplement amounting to four and eighty-one one-hundredths per cent (4.81%)
34 of base State salary schedules for the year 1958-59; and

35 WHEREAS, General Fund Revenues for the year 1960-61 have been estimated to
36 exceed two hundred eighty-three million, two hundred twelve thousand, nine hundred fifty-five
37 dollars (\$283,212,955) by twenty-six million eight hundred ninety-seven thousand dollars
38 (\$26,897,000) and public school academic and vocational teachers, principals, supervisors, and
39 superintendents are expected to receive from such contingency appropriation salary
40 supplements amounting to five per cent (5%) of base State salary schedules for the year
41 1958-59; and

42 WHEREAS, there are in certain child care institutions of the state academic and
43 vocational teachers, principals, and supervisors who are paid according to the public school

1 salary schedule; and whereas there was no contingency salary appropriation for such academic
 2 and vocational teachers, principals, and supervisors for the years 1959-60 and 1960-61; and
 3 WHEREAS, the General Assembly desires that all academic and vocational
 4 teachers, principals, and supervisors paid according to the public school salary schedule be
 5 provided for on an equal basis: Now, therefore,

 7 The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:

 9 **Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the State to the
 10 Department of Administration for the purpose of supplementing salaries of academic and
 11 vocational teachers, principals, and supervisors in the following child care institutions of the
 12 State paid according to the public school salary schedule sums not to exceed ninety-eight
 13 thousand, six hundred twenty-one dollars (\$98,621) and according to the following schedule:

 26 **Sec. 2.** The appropriation for salary supplements for the year 1959-60 shall be used
 27 to provide a four and eighty-one one-hundredths per cent (4.81%) salary increase for eligible
 28 academic and vocational teachers, principals, and supervisors in the respective institutions.
 29 Actual percentages shall be computed upon the basis of the 1958-59 base State salary schedule
 30 for public school personnel.

31 **Sec. 3.** The appropriation for salary supplements for the year 1960-61 are
 32 contingent and shall be paid only if the General Fund Revenues for the year 1960-61 exceed
 33 two hundred eighty-three million, two hundred twelve thousand, nine hundred fifty-five dollars
 34 (\$283,212,955). For each one million, four hundred forty-four thousand, twenty-eight dollars
 35 (\$1,444,028) that General Fund Revenues collected for the year 1960-61 shall exceed two
 36 hundred eighty-three million, two hundred twelve thousand, nine hundred fifty-five dollars
 37 (\$283,212,955) a one per cent (1%) salary supplement shall be paid to the eligible personnel
 38 employed in said year; provided, that individual salaries shall not be thereby cumulatively
 39 supplemented more than five per cent (5%). Actual percentages shall be computed upon the
 40 basis of the 1958-59 base State salary schedule for public school personnel.

41 **Sec. 4.** The Department of Administration is hereby directed to pay the aforesaid
 42 supplemental salary only to those eligible academic and vocational teachers, principals, and
 43 supervisors who were regularly employed in the respective child care institutions during a part
 44 or all of the regular school term ending prior to June 30, 1960 and June 30, 1961, respectively.

45 **Sec. 5.** Deductions shall not be made under the provisions of Chapter 135 of the
 46 General Statutes, "Teachers and State Employees Retirement System Act", from that portion of
 47 the salaries paid in accordance with this Act.

48 **Sec. 6.** All laws and clauses of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

49 **Sec. 7.** This Act shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1961.
