## CHAPTER 1152 HOUSE BILL 750

1	AN ACT APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE REPAIR AND RESTORATION OF THE
2	WRIGHT TAVERN.
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4	WHEREAS, The Wright Tavern in Wentworth, Rockingham County is described by
5	Thomas T. Waterman, the State's leading architectural historian, as the finest surviving
6	example of a two-story, frame Dog-Run building, and
7	WHEREAS, The Wright Tavern is associated with some of North Carolina's
8	greatest Statesmen of the nineteenth century, among them Congressman Thomas Settle, I, Chief
9	Justice Thomas Ruffin, Governor John M. Morehead, Governor and Senator David S. Reid,
10	Legislator and historian Archibald DeBow Murphey, Brigadier General and Governor Alfred
11	M. Scales, and Governor Robert B. Glenn, and
12	WHEREAS, with funds raised from private sources, and supplemented by an
13	appropriation of the Rockingham County Board of Commissioners, The Wright Tavern, an
14	architecturally unique early Tavern (1812), has been purchased and is now being restored as an
15	historic site, County museum and educational facility, and
16	WHEREAS, the Rockingham County Historical Society, Inc., in cooperation with
17	the State Department of Archives and History, has outlined a five-year restoration program
18	estimated to cost eighty-five thousand dollars (\$85,000.00), and
19	WHEREAS, the Society has developed plans for raising additional funds from
20	private sources, but needs State assistance at this time in order to complete major repairs now
21	underway without interruption or postponement;
22	NOW, THEREFORE,
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24	The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:
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26	Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the State
27	Department of Archives and History the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) to be
28	used for the repair and restoration of The Wright Tavern, upon the condition that fifteen
29	thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) be raised in non-state matching funds by the Rockingham
30	Historical Society, Inc
31	Sec. 2. All laws and clauses of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.
32	<b>Sec. 3.</b> This Act shall be in full force and effect from and after its ratification.
