## CHAPTER 348 SENATE BILL 222

1	AN ACT TO CLARIFY G.S. 20-28.1 RELATING TO REVOCATION OF DRIVING
2	PRIVILEGES OF PERSONS WHO DRIVE WHILE LICENSES ARE REVOKED OR
3	SUSPENDED.

5	The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:
6	
7	Section 1. G.S. 20-28.1, as the same appears in the 1965 Replacement Volume 1C
8	of the General Statutes, is rewritten to read as follows:
9	"Section 20-28.1 Conviction of moving offense committed while driving during period of
10	suspension or revocation of license. (a) Upon receipt of notice of conviction of any person of
11	a motor vehicle moving offense, such offense having been committed while such person's
12	driving privilege was in a state of suspension or revocation, the Department shall revoke such
13	person's driving privilege for an additional period of time as set forth in subsection (b) hereof.
14	(b) When a driving privilege is subject to revocation under this section, the additional
15	period of revocation shall be as follows:
16	(1) A first such revocation shall be for one (1) year;
17	(2) A second such revocation shall be for two (2) years; and
18	(3) A third or subsequent such revocation shall be permanent.
19	(c) Any person whose driving privilege has been permanently revoked under this
20	section may apply for a new license after three (3) years from the commencement of the
21	permanent revocation. Upon the filing of such application, the Department may, with or
22	without a hearing, issue a new license upon satisfactory proof that the former licensee has been
23	of good behavior for a minimum of three (3) years from the last date of revocation and that his
24	conduct and attitude are such as to entitle him to favorable consideration."
25	Sec. 2. All laws and clauses of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.
26	<b>Sec. 3.</b> This Act shall become effective July 1, 1969.
