CHAPTER 841 SENATE BILL 608

1	AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 141 OF THE GENERAL STATUTES TO PROVIDE FOR
2	THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A LATERAL SEAWARD BOUNDARY BETWEEN THIS
3	STATE AND THE STATE OF VIRGINIA.

5	THAT, WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the State of North Carolina that the
6	lateral seaward boundaries of the State be fixed and determined; and
7	WHEREAS, the State of Virginia desires that a lateral seaward boundary between
8	the two States be so established; and
9	WHEREAS, the seaward limit of North Carolina shall be and remain as it now is or
10	as it may hereafter be fixed by the Congress of the United States; and
11	WHEREAS, such boundary is to be considered to extend beyond the seaward limit
12	of the sovereign jurisdiction of this State should any need for further delimitation arise;
13	NOW, THEREFORE,

15	The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:

17	Section 1. That Chapter 141 of the General Statutes be and is hereby amended by
18	adding thereto a new Section to be designated as G.S. 141-8 to read as follows:
