

Charter of the Town of Grimesland (Pitt)
Chapter 222 of the Private Laws of 1893

Charter	PrL1893-222	An Act to Incorporate the Town of Grimesland in Pitt County.
	1943-231	Section 5 of 1943-231 did not amend the Charter, but added language fixing the compensation of the mayor and members of the board of aldermen.
	1967-736	Amended Section 5 of 1943-231 to increase the compensation that may be paid the mayor and board of aldermen.
Section 2	2004-32	Rewrote Section 2 (corporate limits).
Section 3	1943-231	Rewrote Section 3 (Officers) to increase the number of aldermen from three to five, and to change the election schedule from annual to biennial.
	1957-1153	Rewrote Section 3 to provide that the Town shall have five aldermen.
Section 3A	1957-1153	Added Section 3A, which provided that beginning in July 1959, the board of aldermen shall elect a Mayor from among their number, and the person selected as Mayor shall serve a two-year term.
Section 3B	1957-1153	Added Section 3B, which authorized the aldermen to choose a person from the qualified voters of the Town to serve as judge of the Town's municipal court.
Section 3C	1957-1153	Added Section 3C, which provided that fees paid in the Town's municipal court shall be turned over to the Town's treasurer.
Section 4	1943-231	Rewrote Section 4 (Election) to provide that Town officers shall be elected biennially instead of annually.
Section 5	1943-231	Rewrote Section 5 (Duty of officers to qualify) to provide that the board shall appoint a treasurer, clerk to the board, and police officers, and that these officials appointed by the board of commissioners shall take an oath of office and post a bond.
Section 6	1943-231	Rewrote Section 6 (effective date) to provide that vacancies in elective offices shall be filled in accordance with general law.
