The North Carolina Human Trafficking Commission (HTC) is housed within the North Carolina Administrative Office of the Courts (NCAOC). Both entities have been in regular communication with the Office of State Budget and Management and the N.C. Pandemic Relief Office regarding transfer of monies within the State Fiscal Recovery Fund. The following are updates on progress since our last report:

Appropriations Act: Session Law 2021-180

The grant staffing structure through ARPA / SFRF funds consists of a grant administrator and 5 grants managers. Also, 2 temporary staff to assist with the primary and secondary reviews.

16.20A & 16.20B Grants for Nonprofit Organizations Providing Services to Victims of Human Trafficking

Summary of Activities:

These 17 grantees have all been through 6 quarters. Two agencies have ended their periods of performance and are either closed or in closing status.

Given the limitations on Administrative Costs for 16.20, we are re-evaluating the remaining funds allocated for a Grant Manager position. Initial assessment indicates the administrative funding will not last the life cycle of the grant awards. Oversite of these agencies will be assigned to existing grants managers.

HTC is completing the process to enable a Grants Management System to begin early spring 2025.



The 16.20 agencies have been awarded a total of \$3,039,975.16 in funding from Section 16.20A and \$1,140,000 from Section 16.20B. The distribution from Section 16.20A shows that most agencies have received 95% of their allocated funds, with five agencies already having received 100%. Section 16.20B has also disbursed 80% of its funds, which aligns with expectations given the two-year performance period. Grant staff have received all reports from quarters 1 through 5 and are currently conducting primary, secondary, and final reviews. Closeout process with two agencies was completed and scheduling necessary site visits. Implementing of the Grants Management System will greatly enhance our ability to track detailed spending, streamline the reports from agencies, and create reports on basic data. Our goal is to have the system fully operational and in use by agencies by July 2025. Currently using Smartsheet for reporting. The 16.21 agencies have been awarded a total of \$3,800,000 in funding from Section 16.21. Round one totaling \$1,981,587.37 and round two totaling \$1,818,412.63. The funds awarded from Section 16.21 show that the 11 agencies in round one received 100% of their requested budget. Round two had 11 awarded agencies which all received a little over 90% of their requested budget. These allocations align with expectations of their given periods of performance. Grant staff have received all reports from round one agencies for quarters 1 & 2 and are currently conducting primary, secondary, and final reviews. Next steps continue monitoring these agencies through to closure as well as scheduling any necessary site visits. Round two agencies are concluding the signing of contracts with updated budgets and scope of work to begin October 1, 2024. Next steps for round two is the implementing of the Grants Management System to greatly enhance our ability to track detailed spending, streamline the reports from agencies and create reports on basic data.
