

# NC Pre-Kindergarten Program Annual Report SFY 2012-13 Session Law 2012-142, Section 10.1.(g)



March 15, 2013





Session Law 2012-142, Section 10.1.(g) directed the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Child Development and Early Education (DCDEE) to submit an annual report for the NC Pre-Kindergarten (NC Pre-K) program no later than March 15 of each year to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations, the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services, the Senate Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, the House of Representatives Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, the Office of State Budget and Management, and the Fiscal Research Division. Information related to four topics was requested and is provided below.

## The Number of Children Participating in the NC Pre-K Program:

The number of children initially in contract for NC Pre-K services for the 2012/2013 program year was 24,744. During the expansion implementation from late October 2012 through January 2013 approximately 4,900 additional children were in contract to begin receiving services; therefore, the 2012/2013 program year total is approximately 29,644 children that are expected to be served.

## Prior Participation in other Preschool Programs for NC Pre-K Children

The Division of Child Development and Early Education's NC Pre-K database does not currently collect information related to prior preschool participation when a child enrolls in NC Pre-K. In the 2013-2014 school year, a data field will be added to the system to capture the level and type of preschool participation at the time of application.

## **NC Pre-K Program Annual Evaluation**

The Division of Child Development and Early Education has a contract with the Frank Porter Graham Child Development Institute to conduct an annual evaluation of the NC Pre-K program. During the 2011-2012 program year, the evaluation included an analysis of the characteristics of local programs, the population served and the quality of classroom services provided. A variety of measurement tools were used to assess classroom practices to determine quality in both Pre-K classrooms and teacher-child interactions.

The Executive Summary for the evaluation reported the following key findings:

- The NC Pre-K Program has not changed substantially in comparison to prior years of its predecessor program More at Four.
- NC Pre-K teachers generally reported being satisfied with their work environment.
- The quality of classroom practices and teacher-child interactions in NC Pre-K was in the medium to high range overall.
- The quality of the NC Pre-K classrooms was similar in almost all areas when compared to recent years of More at Four.

The evaluation continues to show high marks in classroom quality and positive teacher-child interactions. Session Law 2011-145 charged the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), with maintaining the high quality standards that had been in place from the inception of the program. The annual evaluation report of NC Pre-K illustrates that program quality has been maintained. A full report for the 2011-2012 NC Pre-K evaluation will be available on the DCDEE website later this month.

The Division of Child Development and Early Education expects to provide NC Pre-K services for approximately 29,644 children during the 2012/2013 program year. The appropriated budget for the NC Pre-K Program for SFY 12-13 is \$151,751,365, which includes funding from state appropriations, lottery transfers, a non-profit funding reduction, and \$20 million in one-time funds transferred to DCDEE.
