Care, PLLC/Arjumand Syed, MD

Dear Members:

Section 114-2.5 of the North Carolina General Statutes requires the Attorney General to report to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations and the Chairs of the Appropriations Subcommittees on Justice and Public Safety regarding all settlements and court orders which result in more than \$75,000.00 being paid to the State. Pursuant to that statute, I am writing regarding the settlement of claims for Medicaid reimbursement to the state and federal governments in the above-referenced matter. Pursuant to federal law (42 C.F.R. § 433.320) recoveries in these cases are shared on a pro rata basis by the state and federal governments.

A settlement has been executed between New Hope Urgent Care, PLLC/Arjumand Syed and the State of North Carolina.

The settlement resolves allegations that from January 1, 2018 through July 11, 2021, New Hope Urgent Care, PLLC/Arjumand Syed, MD billed for CPT 99214 - (Evaluation & Management for an established patient in an office or outpatient location),

which had no supporting clinical documentation, were not medically necessary, and which were performed in violation of Division of Health Benefits Clinical Coverage Policy.

Under the terms of North Carolina's settlement, the State of North Carolina will recover \$170,000.00. Of that amount the federal government will receive \$97,410.00 for North Carolina's federal portion of Medicaid recoveries. In addition, pursuant to Article IX, Section 7 of the North Carolina Constitution and G.S. § 115C-457.1, the penalty portion of the settlement in the amount of \$35,075.49 will be paid to the Civil Penalty Forfeiture Fund for the support of North Carolina public schools. Pursuant to G.S. § 115C-457.2 and G.S. § 1-608(c), the North Carolina Department of Justice will receive \$3,480.69 for investigative costs and costs of collection.
