#### REPORT REQUIREMENTS

#### SUMMARY OF THE LEGISLATION

In accordance with Session Law 2017-57 (SB 257), sec. 8.8 (d), the Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate/Cambridge AICE Teacher Bonus Program provides funding to reward teachers of students who achieve successful results on advanced course examinations. The state recognizes Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and Cambridge International Education (CIE) courses as advanced courses. Each Local Education Agency (LEA) and public charter school is entitled to funding based on the exam results of their students. The bonus would have been based on exams taken in the 2020-2021 school year, specified as \$50 per exam at a score of 3 or above on AP, 4 or above on IB, and "C" or higher on AICE examinations, with a maximum of \$3,500 per teacher, per year. To be eligible, the teacher must be teaching in the same LEA or public school at least from the school year the data are collected until January 1 of the year that the bonus is paid.

#### REPORTING REQUIREMENT

The State Board of Education is reporting on advanced course teacher performance and on the bonus amount allotted for advanced course teachers in each LEA and public school in North Carolina. The impact on teacher retention is not able to be determined at this time.

#### **Distribution of Funds**

The Department of Public Instruction (DPI) distributed the funds to the LEAs and charter schools based on legislation and SBE policy. The allocations were available by LEA and charter school as shown in the table below.

The allocations to LEAs and charter schools are based on the number of exams eligible for a bonus, as reported by the College Board, International Baccalaureate Organization, and Cambridge International. These allocations are the maximum that could be paid out to teachers. It is anticipated that not all the funds will be dispersed due to the eligibility requirements of the employment of the teacher and the maximum cap for allocations. At the time of the report, final expenditures by LEAs and charter schools are not available as disbursements have not yet been finalized. The impact on the bonus program on recruitment and retention of teachers of advanced courses has yet to be determined. However, anecdotally from conversations in the field, we believe teachers value the bonus.

#### Final Allocation Amounts for 2020-2021 school year

NCDPI allocated a total of \$3,542,050 for the Advanced Course Bonus Program for the 2020-2021 school year, including \$3,069,200 for 61,384 AP eligible exams, \$457,850 for 9,157 IB eligible exams, \$15,000 for 300 AICE eligible exams, and \$57,000 for 1,140 AP eligible exams taken through NCVPS.
