INTRODUCTION

BACKGROUND: SL 2021-180 Section 7.27(a) established a grant program during the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium for qualifying public-school units (PSU) to improve teacher quality and mitigate learning loss, notwithstanding G.S. 115C-296.2, by reimbursing teachers for the cost of the participation fee for National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) certification, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

BACKGROUND OF PROGRAM

During the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, a PSU with at least one qualifying public school applied to the Department of Public Instruction for grant funds to reimburse teachers employed in the unit for the cost of the participation fee for NBPTS certification. Schools receiving funds were prioritized according to legislation.

A qualifying public school is a public school that meets any of the following criteria:

1. Is identified as a low-performing school pursuant to G.S. 115C-105.37 or G.S. 115C-218.94.
2. Is identified as an innovative school pursuant to G.S. 115C-75.5.
3. Enrolled a student body in the school year prior to the application for reimbursement consisting of at least ten percent (10%) of students identified as at-risk pursuant to State Board of Education policy DROP-001.

Based on the criteria above 331 PSUs were eligible to apply.

No later than January 15, 2022, and each subsequent year thereafter in which funds allocated pursuant to this subdivision are awarded, the Department shall report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee, the Senate Appropriations Committee on Education/Higher Education, the House Appropriations Committee on Education, and the Fiscal Research Division on the impact of the program, including at least the following information:

1. PSU applying for and receiving grants.
2. Number of teachers receiving reimbursements.
3. Demographic information of teachers receiving reimbursements.
4. Employment status of teachers receiving reimbursements, including the public school where the teacher is employed and whether the teacher remains employed with his or her original qualifying public school.
5. Licensure areas of teachers receiving reimbursements.
6. Effect of the program on the performance and growth of students taught by teachers receiving reimbursements.

Demographic information about recipients, employment status of teachers receiving reimbursement, and description of effects of program on performance and growth of students taught by these teachers is not available at the time of this report as funds have recently been distributed to PSUs.

PRC 198 was written with the intent to provide reimbursement to educators seeking National Board Certification. On April 11, 2022, PRC 198 opened in the Comprehensive Continuous Improvement Plan (CCIP) and the application process closed May 31, 2022. Initial data revealed that only 42 PSUs completed and submitted the application for funding. Once the 42 completed applications were reviewed

only 38 PSUs are eligible to receive funding. Four of the 42 PSUs who applied were denied because they did not meet the criterion set forth by legislation One PSU Elkin City, has opted out and will revert the funds back to NCDPI due to a calculations error made when they applied for their reimbursement amount.

On August 4th, 2022, the State Board of Education (SBE) approved the recommendation to fund 38 eligible PSUs for \$1.2 million dollars. On August 30, 2022, North Carolina Department of Public Instruction distributed the allotted funds to each eligible PSU to be utilized for educators seeking initial National Board Certification.

NCDPI IMPLEMENTATION AND STATUS REPORTS

During the month of September 2022, 38 eligible PSUs were notified of the monitoring expectations and were also given a due date of November 18, 2022, for the submission of their reports. However, due to a delay with the Grant Award Notification (GAN) the due date was changed to November 30, 2022. The PSUs are responsible for tracking the disbursement to their educators based on proof of payment. They are also required to maintain accurate data for reporting purposes back to NCDPI. Periodic monitoring audits are established to ensure integrity of use and track of funds. If the funds are not spent by September 30, 2024, they must be returned to US Department of Education.

A status report was submitted to JLEOC in January 2023. The funds spent and demographic information about recipients' status of teachers receiving reimbursement and description of effects of the program of performance and growth of students taught by these teachers was not available at the time of the report as funds were disbursed in November 2022. One PSU Elkin City opted out and reverted the funds back to NCDPI due to a calculation error made when they applied for their reimbursement amount. 32 PSUs provided a report indicating their process for reimbursements will begin in January of 2023.

Reporting Structure for this grant are as follows:

Year 1 – Report 1 – Due January 15, 2023 (status report of the program)

Year 2 – Report 2 – Due January 15, 2024 (January 2023 – August 2023 data and reports)

Year 3 – Report 3 – Due January 15, 2025 (*August 2023 – September 2024 data and reports)

*All funds in this program should be spent by September 2024.

January 15, 2024 – Year 2 – PRC198 - PSU Summary Participation Reports

Note: Funding was disbursed to all 38 participating districts in Year 1. The program started with a budget of \$1.2 million dollars. The January 15, 2024, report represents Year 2 of the grant program. Of the participating districts in Year 2, 438 teachers were enrolled in the National Board Certification program. These teachers are on target to receive National Board Certification by year end 2024 and 2025. A total of \$499,822.37 was spent during the January - December cycle with some districts requesting additional funding for other teachers to participate. Overall, 438 teachers remained with their employing LEA's for the 2023 Year (with the exception of 1 in Alexander County Schools), and are on target to be certified. While the program seems to be working moderately for some districts, there are some districts that are still not utilizing the funds. Clinton City, East Wake Academy, Macon, Tyrrell, and Union counties did not have any participation in the program this year. At least 5 districts reported that they did not have funds for 109 teachers to participate. Appendix A will include a summary sheet for all districts. Also in Appendix A, you will find the employment status of teachers receiving reimbursements, licensure information, amount awarded per district, amount distributed, amount of funding available, and the number that could not be funded. Also, information is provided from some districts on the effect of the program and the performance and growth of students taught by teachers receiving reimbursements.

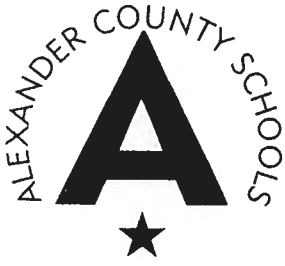

 - i. The two-year teacher evaluation rating and EVAAS scores documented in the demographic information document underscores that teachers entering in the NBPTS process exhibit either effectiveness in their instructional methods, as reflected in their EVAAS scores and evaluation ratings, or as a need for professional growth to impact teacher effectiveness and student achievement. By considering that all but one teacher remained employed with Brunswick County Schools, the reimbursement grant not only aids in professional development but also serves as an incentive to retain teachers. Retaining dedicated and trained educators is crucial for fostering and maintaining a positive and successful learning environment. Looking ahead, we anticipate a continued positive impact on performance and growth of students taught by teachers who have received the NBPTS reimbursement grant. The investment in these teachers not only enhances their individual professional development and effectiveness but also improves academic performance and continued growth.

Craven County Schools received grant funding from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards Certificate Fee Reimbursement Grant - **PRC198** Program. Currently, two (2) teachers have been reimbursed from these funds. The funds reimbursed from January 15, 2023 - August 31, 2023, allotment is \$2,800.

Both teachers are still employed with Craven County Schools at their original qualifying schools. One teacher works at Roger Bell New Tech Academy Elementary School and the other teacher is employed at Havelock Middle School. The licensure areas of teachers receiving reimbursements are Elementary Education K-6 and Language Arts 6-9/Mathematics 6-9.

The effect of the program has a positive impact on student performance and growth. One of the teachers is a high performing teacher and is receiving the state and local bonuses for her work with her students. Her students met or exceeded growth on the North Carolina End-of-Grade (EOG) tests. In addition, this program has provided financial assistance to teachers and has encouraged teachers who are working in low-performing schools to seek National Board certification.

We were unable to fund three (3) teachers because they moved from the original qualifying low-performing school to another school in the PSU. Even though, they passed the National Board certification; however, the new school is not deemed as a low-performing school. Another NB teacher moved from a low performing school to another instructional position for the district.

Mount Airy City Schools utilized the full amount, \$22, 868.00 of our PRC 198 grant funds during the 2022-2023 school year for the following teachers:

- 16 educators pursued their NB certification and received reimbursement from PRC 198 awarded to Mount Airy City Schools
 - 5 teachers from BH Tharrington Primary School (K-2)
 - 5 teachers from Jones Intermediate School (3-5)
 - 2 teachers from Mount Airy Middle School (6-8)
 - 3 teachers and 1 school counselor from Mount Airy High School (9-12)
- It should be noted that all of these educators continue to be employed by MACS for the 2023-2024 school year.
 - All of these teachers have impacted students positively based on their EVAAS
 - We have been able to retain all of these teachers to further impact our students. Growth was noted in the following areas that are impacted by these teachers:
 - Kindergarten exceeded their proficiency goal. BOY grew from 28 to 73%
 - First Grade exceeded their proficiency goal. BOY grew from 48 to 69%

- BH Tharrington and NCDPI- 2nd graders grew 12% overall proficiency for the year.
- 5 of the 16 teachers also serve in advanced teaching roles and support a larger capacity of students through the teachers they support through coaching, mentoring, co-teaching, co-planning, etc...
 - In addition, 1 of these teachers utilized her literacy knowledge and skills to provide professional development to teacher assistants regarding early reading skills and small group instruction
- We also enhanced our first district National Board Cohort by having the opportunity to support and fund all teachers choosing to pursue this deeply challenging professional development
- Our PSU did not have to turn down any teachers requesting National Board reimbursement. We utilized all of the grant funding (\$22,868) and then paid approximately \$2,000 out of our pockets for the additional reimbursements.

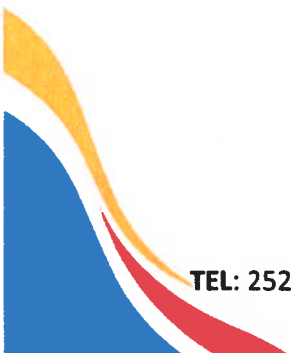

Winston-Salem/ Forsyth County Schools, Unit 340 received funding via PRC 198. 33 teachers received reimbursements for participation fees for the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) certification. All eligible teachers were funded. There was \$36,950 reimbursed to teacher for participation fees from January 15, 2023 - August 31, 2023.

Of the 33 teachers, 32 remained employed at his or her original school with 1 resigning; this represents 97% of the teachers. WS/FCS analyzed EVAAS data to determine the effect of the program on the performance and growth of students taught by teachers receiving reimbursements. Of the 32 teachers, 18 had EVAAS data for SY 21-22 and SY 22-23.

The EVAAS growth indicator (meets, exceeds, or does not meet growth), 14 teachers maintained either Meets Expected Growth or Exceeds Expected Growth between those two school years. 2 teachers increased from Meets Expected Growth to Exceeds Expected Growth. Only 2 teachers decreased in growth index ratings.
