2) The nature of the resolution of every incident of any violation of this Article, G.S. 14-34.5(b), 14-34.7(b), or 14-34.7(c)(2) involving an employee or contractor of a detention facility operated by the State.

#### CY 2023:

Sixteen (16) acts that appear to meet the elements of G.S. 14-34.7(b) and G.S. 14-34.7(c)(2), Certain Assaults on a Person Employed at a Detention Facility, occurred in CY 2023. The following delinquent petitions or criminal charges were filed for individual juveniles housed in a juvenile detention center or youth development center:

- One charge for G.S. 14-33(c)(4), Assault on a Government Official, which resulted in a conviction and active sentence of 30 days.
- One petition for G.S. 14-258.4(a), Malicious Conduct by a Prisoner, and one petition for 14-33(c)(4),
  Assault on a Government Official, both of which were transferred to Superior Court and remain
  pending.
- One charge for 14-33(a), Simple Assault, which resulted in a conviction and active sentence of 30 days.
- One petition for 14-33(c)(4), Assault on a Government Official, which was dismissed.
- One petition for 14-258.4, Malicious Conduct by a Prisoner, which is pending adjudication.
- One charge for 14-33(c)(4), Assault on a Government Official, which was pled to a lesser offense of 14-33(a) Simple Assault with an active sentence of 30 days.
- One petition for 14-34.7(c)(2), Certain Assaults on a Person Employed at a Detention Facility, which resulted in an adjudication of delinquent but is pending disposition.
- One charge of 14-34.7(b), Simple Assault, which remains pending.

Please note that more than one juvenile may have been involved in any individual incident or a juvenile may have received more than one charge or petition per incident and therefore the number of formal charges or petitions listed above may differ from the total counts provided in (1).

The remaining potential violations of G.S. 14-34.7(b) and G.S. 14-34.7(c)(2) were each resolved consistent with internal policy.
