The Statewide Misdemeanant Confinement Program (SMCP) manages the housing, transportation and medical expenses of state inmates housed in a local jail who have been convicted of a misdemeanor crime with a sentence of 91 days or more and those convicted of a misdemeanor Driving While Impaired (DWI) offense. The North Carolina Sheriffs' Association (NCSA) provides a critical role in managing the day-to-day operations of the program. The Monthly Status Report is prepared by NCSA staff and then sent to all interested parties. The report includes the daily inmate population for the reported month, the number of volunteered beds in the program, the number of confinements in response to violations (CRV's) for the month, the number of DWI's for the month, roadway cleanup status for the reported month, and the SMCP reimbursement statement.

Pursuant to G.S. § 148-32.1 (b2) the North Carolina Sheriffs' Association must provide a monthly report on the status of the Statewide Misdemeanant Confinement Program to the Office of State Budget and Management and the Fiscal Research Division no later than the 15th day of each month.

NCSA staff continues to process entries into, and releases out of, the Statewide Misdemeanant Confinement Program. The daily population of SMCP is monitored and recorded. Inmate bed space allocation continues to be tracked throughout the state as well. These data points are necessary to be able to determine if supply is meeting demand.

All counties holding SMCP inmates continue to receive reimbursements for housing and transportation costs. The NCSA staff continues to ensure reimbursements are calculated appropriately through a monthly reconciliation process. All reimbursements for the month of December 2024 were issued to counties on a timely basis, according to policy, on January 31, 2025.

The county map has been adjusted to differentiate between receiving counties (those with an active SMCP contract), receiving counties with zero beds – currently sending only, and sending only counties. The map can be found on page 8 of the Monthly Status Report.

In the 2021 Regular Session, the North Carolina General Assembly enacted Senate Bill 105 [S.L. 2021 – 180] – the 2021 Appropriations Act. This bill included a provision that increased the reimbursement rate from \$40 per day to \$60 per day for all SMCP inmates in those counties that utilize SMCP inmate labor to perform at least 500 work hours of roadway cleanup per month. In the 2023 Regular Session, the North Carolina General Assembly enacted House Bill 259 [S.L. 2023-134] – the 2023 Appropriations Act and provided additional funds to allow the increased reimbursement rate to continue through 2025.

The below table reflects the counties that used SMCP inmate labor for roadway cleanup in January 2025.

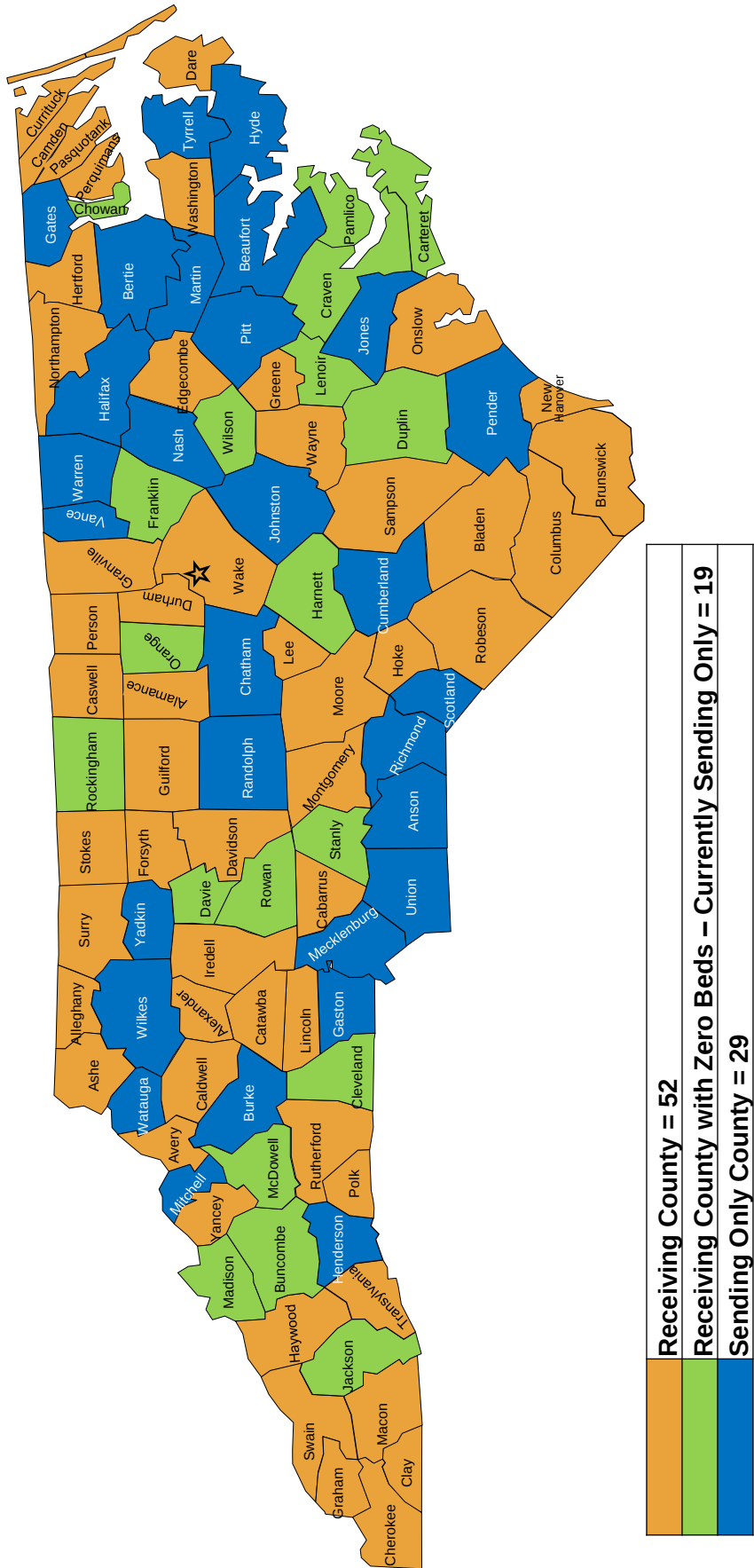
