A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR A CERTIFICATION FILING FEE FOR INSURERS
2 CONTRACTING WITH UTILIZATION REVIEW ORGANIZATIONS; TO
3 PROVIDE FOR EXAMINATIONS OF SUCH INSURERS AND
4 ORGANIZATIONS; AND TO EXTEND THE RULES FOR UTILIZATION
5 REVIEW STANDARDS TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURERS AND
6 MULTIPLE EMPLOYER WELFARE ARRANGEMENTS.
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8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

9 Section 1. G.S. 58-50-60 reads as rewritten:

10 "**§ 58-50-60. Rules, for precertification practices fees, and charges for utilization**
11 **review.**

12 (a) This section applies to all ~~accident and health~~ insurers under Articles 1
13 through 64 of this Chapter, all third-party administrators and preferred provider
14 arrangements, all entities subject to Articles 65 through 67 of this Chapter, ~~and all self-~~
15 ~~funded health benefit workers' compensation plans subject to G.S. 97-93, and all~~
16 multiple employer welfare arrangements plans.

17 (b) The Commissioner shall adopt reasonable rules governing ~~precertification~~
18 utilization review practices and forms and utilization review organizations ~~affiliated~~
19 doing business with the entities subject to this section.

20 (c) Each entity specified in subsection (a) of this section that is subject to rules
21 adopted by the Commissioner pursuant to this section shall pay an annual,
22 nonrefundable filing fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) whenever it files the certification
23 required under those rules.

1 (d) Each entity specified in subsection (a) of this section that is subject to rules
2 adopted by the Commissioner pursuant to this section shall reimburse the Commissioner
3 for expenses and compensation incurred by the Commissioner in visiting and examining
4 or auditing the entity or the utilization review organization doing business with the
5 entity."

6 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
