A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW CONCERNING PURCHASE MONEY SECURITY INTERESTS FOR CITIES, COUNTIES, AND WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITIES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 160A-20 reads as rewritten:

"§ 160A-20. ~~Purchase money security~~ Security interests.

(a) Cities, counties, and water and sewer authorities created under Article 1 of Chapter 162A of the General Statutes may purchase or finance the purchase of real or personal property by installment contracts which that create in the property purchased a security interest to secure payment of the purchase money-price to the seller or to an individual or entity advancing moneys or supplying financing for the purchase transaction.

(b) Cities, counties, and water and sewer authorities created under Article 1 of Chapter 162A of the General Statutes may finance the construction or repair of fixtures or improvements on real property by contracts that create in the fixtures or improvements, or in all or some portion of the property on which the fixtures or improvements are located, or in both, a security interest to secure repayment of moneys advanced or made available for such construction or repair.

(c) Cities, counties, and water and sewer authorities created under Article 1 of Chapter 162A of the General Statutes may use escrow accounts in connection with the

1 advance funding of transactions authorized by this section, whereby the proceeds of
2 such advance funding are invested pending disbursement.

3 (d) No contract entered into under this section may contain a nonsubstitution
4 clause that restricts the right of a city, a county, or a water and sewer authority created
5 under Article 1 of Chapter 162A of the General Statutes to:

6 (1) Continue to provide a service or activity; or

7 (2) Replace or provide a substitute for any fixture, improvement, project,
8 or property financed or purchased pursuant to such contract.

9 (e) A contract entered into under this section is subject to the applicable provisions
10 of approval by the Local Government Commission under Article 8 of Chapter 159 of the
11 General Statutes if it:

12 (1) Meets the standards set out in G.S. 159-148(a)(1), 159-148(a)(2), and
13 159-148(a)(3); and

14 (2) Is not exempted from the provisions of that Article by one of the
15 exemptions contained in G.S. 159-148(b).

16 (f) No deficiency judgment may be rendered against any city, county, or water
17 and sewer authority created under Article 1 of Chapter 162A of the General Statutes in
18 any action for breach of a contractual obligation authorized by this section, and the
19 taxing power of a city or county is not and may not be pledged directly or indirectly to
20 secure any moneys due to the seller under a contract authorized by this section. Any
21 contract made or entered into by a city or county before June 1, 1979, which would have been
22 valid hereunder is hereby validated, ratified and confirmed."

23 Sec. 2. (a) Any contract made or entered into, prior to the date of ratification
24 of this act, by a city, a county, or a water and sewer authority created under Article 1 of
25 Chapter 162A of the General Statutes which would have been valid under G.S. 160A-20
26 as rewritten by this act is hereby validated, ratified, and confirmed.

27 (b) Any contract made or entered into, prior to the date of ratification of this
28 act, by a city, a county, or a water and sewer authority created under Article 1 of
29 Chapter 162A of the General Statutes which would have been valid under G.S. 160A-
30 20:

31 (1) As it existed prior to the ratification of this act; or

32 (2) As rewritten by this act

33 except that the Local Government Commission did not approve the contract, is hereby
34 validated, ratified, and confirmed.

35 Sec. 3. This act clarifies the authority of cities and counties to purchase and
36 finance real or personal property and to expand this authority. It shall not be interpreted
37 to limit or restrict the authority of cities and counties to purchase or finance the
38 purchase of real or personal property pursuant to any other sections of the General
39 Statutes.

40 Sec. 4. This act is effective upon ratification.
