SENATE BILL 1306

Short Title: Haywood Schools Junked Cars Funds.

(Public)

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE HAYWOOD SCHOOLS FOR A
3 JUNKED CARS PROGRAM.

4 Whereas, the Haywood County Schools propose to establish a program to
5 pick up and dispose of junked and abandoned vehicles by the Vocational Education
6 Department; and

7 Whereas, the program will be established at Pisgah and Tuscola High Schools
8 where teams of students under the supervision of the teachers from the Automotive
9 Section will supervise the recovery of the junked and abandoned vehicles; and

10 Whereas, with the use of two wreckers purchased for this program, the teams
11 will recover the junked and abandoned vehicles and move them to assigned junk dealers
12 receiving payment for each vehicle recovered; and

13 Whereas, the benefits of this program will be:

- 14 (1) Removal of the junked cars throughout the county, with the attendant
15 improvement of appearance of the county;
- 16 (2) Haywood County would not have to pay for the removal of the
17 vehicles and the Haywood County Schools would derive income from
18 the program; and
- 19 (3) The students would benefit from the educational aspects of the
20 program and the fostering of an entrepreneurial spirit and highlighting
21 the School-Based Enterprise concept in establishing this pilot project
22 for the entire State.

23 Whereas, this program would be unique within the State and, if successful,
24 could serve as the basis for expanding the program statewide; Now, therefore,

1 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

2 Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$50,000
3 for the 1989-90 fiscal year to the Haywood County School System to purchase two
4 wreckers, purchase insurance, and provide operating expenses for the junked and
5 abandoned vehicle pick-up and disposal program of the Haywood County Schools.

6 Sec. 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
