The Department shall establish and administer a statewide AIDS Prevention 8 9 and Education Program. In administering the program, the Department shall: Use health education and other methods that do the following: 10 (1) Improve the awareness of individuals, communities and high 11 a. 12 risk group members about how Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) is transmitted and how to avoid acquiring or 13 transmitting infection, and 14 Promote changes in behavior that reduce the risk of acquiring or 15 <u>b.</u> transmitting this infection; 16 Establish, finance, coordinate, and administer contracts with local 17 (2) 18 health departments to provide community-based AIDS education and risk reduction, and antibody test counseling. In awarding contracts 19 under this subdivision, the Department shall provide an equal base 20 amount to each county and an additional amount to be allocated on the 21 22 needs of the general population;


