	standards would find that the sticker, emblem, or device has a
	predominant tendency to appeal to a prurient interest of minors
	in sex;
b.	The average adult person applying contemporary community
_	standards would find that the depiction of sexually explicit
	nudity or sexual activity in the sticker, emblem, or device is
	patently offensive to prevailing standards in the adult
	community concerning what is suitable for minors; and
<u>c.</u>	To a reasonable person, the sticker, emblem, or device taken as
	a whole lacks serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific
	value for minors.
