2	AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE AFFIXING TO A MOTOR VEHICLE OF ANY			
3	STICKER, DECAL, EMBLEM, DRAWING, PHOTOGRAPH, PAINTING, OR			
4	OTHER DEVICE CONTAINING INDECENT WORDS DESCRIBING SEXUAL			
5	ACTS, EXCRETORY FUNCTIONS, OR PARTS OF THE HUMAN BODY, OR A			
6	VISUAL DEPICTION WHICH IS HARMFUL TO MINORS.			
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
8	Section 1. Article 26 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by			
9	adding a new section to read:			
10	"§ 14-197.1. Affixing indecent or harmful to minors bumper stickers, decals, or			
11	other devices to motor vehicles prohibited.			
12	(a) No person owning, operating, or using a motor vehicle in this State shall			
13	knowingly affix or attach to any part of the motor vehicle any sticker, decal, emblem,			
14	drawing, photograph, painting, or other device containing:			
15	(1) <u>Indecent words describing sexual acts, excretory functions, or parts of</u>			
16	the human body; or			
17	(2) A visual depiction which is harmful to minors and;			
18	(3) Can easily be seen by minors.			
19	(b) A violation of this section is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to			

exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00).

1	(1)	'Harm	aful to minors' means that quality of any sticker, emblem, or	
2	<del>-, ,</del>		e that depicts sexually explicit nudity or sexual activity and that,	
3			as a whole, has the following characteristics:	
4		a.	The average adult person applying contemporary community	
5			standards would find that the sticker, emblem, or device has a	
6			predominant tendency to appeal to a prurient interest of minors	
7			in sex;	
8		<u>b.</u>	The average adult person applying contemporary community	
9			standards would find that the depiction of sexually explicit	
10			nudity or sexual activity in the sticker, emblem, or device is	
11			patently offensive to prevailing standards in the adult	
12			community concerning what is suitable for minors; and	
13		<u>c.</u>	To a reasonable person, the sticker, emblem, or device taken as	
14			a whole lacks serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific	
15			value for minors.	
16	<u>(2)</u>	A stic	ker, emblem, or device is 'indecent' when:	
17		<u>a.</u>	Taken as a whole, it describes, in a patently offensive way, as	
18			determined by contemporary community standards, sexual acts,	
19			excretory functions, or parts of the human body; and	
20		<u>b.</u>	Taken as a whole, it lacks serious literary, artistic, political, or	
21			scientific value."
