A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO INDUSTRIAL OPPORTUNITIES, INC.,
FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW METAL BUILDING AND
PRODUCTION FACILITY.

Whereas, Industrial Industries, Inc., located in Marble, Cherokee County, is
the only sheltered workshop which serves the counties of Clay, Cherokee, and Graham;
and

Whereas, Industrial Opportunities, Inc., is currently serving 61 adults with
disabilities, who work daily to produce goods and services which enter the flow of
commerce both inside and outside the State of North Carolina; and

Whereas, Industrial Opportunities, Inc., provides positions for 37 additional
adults with disabilities in their catchment areas in Clay, Cherokee, and Graham
Counties; and

Whereas, Industrial Opportunities, Inc., wishes to construct a new 7,000
square foot metal building in which it can expand its production operations; and

Whereas, the proposed new building has an estimated construction cost of
approximately one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000); and

Whereas, Industrial Opportunities, Inc., will be able to raise all but thirty
thousand dollars (\$30,000) of the funds necessary for construction of the building by
direct contribution from private and other sources; and

Whereas, Industrial Opportunities, Inc., requests that the State of North
Carolina appropriate the thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) needed to complete the
funding for the construction of the new production facility; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to Industrial
2 Opportunities, Inc., the sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal
3 year to assist in the construction of a new 7,000 square foot metal building for the
4 expansion of production operations.

5 Sec. 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
