A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO DEFINE THE LIMITS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOY. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES WHILE ON DUTY.  The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. Chapter 153A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:  "§ 153A-99. County employee political activity.	
(a) Purpose. The purpose of this section is to ensure that county employee not subjected to political or partisan coercion or interference while performing their duties, and to ensure that public funds are not used for political or partisan activities.
