A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO EXPAND THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR SERVICES 3 FROM THE SICKLE CELL PROGRAM. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 Section 1. Section 172 of Chapter 689 of the 1991 Session Laws reads as 6 rewritten: 7 "Sec. 172. Providers of medical services under the various State programs other than Medicaid offering medical care to citizens of the State shall be reimbursed at rates 8 no more than those under the North Carolina Medical Assistance Program. 9 The Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources may reimburse 10 hospitals at the full prospective per diem rates without regard to the Medical Assistance 11 Program's annual limits on hospital days. When the Medical Assistance Program's per 12 diem rates for inpatient services and its interim rates for outpatient services are used to 13 14 reimburse providers in non-Medicaid medical service programs, retroactive adjustments to claims already paid shall not be required. 15 Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph one of this section, the Department of 16 Environment, Health, and Natural Resources may negotiate with providers of medical 17 services under the various Environment, Health, and Natural Resources programs, other 18 than Medicaid, for rates as close as possible to Medicaid rates for the following 19 contracts or agreements for medical services and purchases of medical 20 purposes: 21 equipment and other medical supplies. These negotiated rates are allowable only to meet the medical needs of its non-Medicaid eligible patients, residents and clients who 22 require such services which cannot be provided when limited to the Medicaid rate. 23
