A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE OWNED LANDS IN ROBESON COUNTY AND TO REQUIRE THE COEXISTENCE OF THE PUBLIC GOLF COURSE CURRENTLY LOCATED ON STATE OWNED LANDS IN ROBESON COUNTY WITH ANY INDIAN CULTURAL CENTER DEVELOPED ON THESE LANDS.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. Any Indian Cultural Center developed or constructed on the approximately 496.31 acres of land in Robeson County acquired for the purpose of developing an Indian Cultural Center shall include the public golf course currently in existence, known as the Riverside Golf Course. The 496.31 acres of State owned lands consist of:
(1) 386.69 acres contained in the deed dated April 14, 1983, and recorded in Deed Book 533, page 164;
(2) 386.69 acres contained in the deed dated August 24, 1984, and recorded in Deed Book 563, page 254;
(3) 99.62 acres contained in the deed dated March 20, 1985, and recorded in Deed Book 575, page 523;
(4) 10.00 acres contained in the deed dated September 11, 1985, and recorded in Deed Book 586, page 142.
Sec. 2. Nothing in this act shall be construed inconsistent with the provisions of Section 18 of Chapter 1074 of the 1989 Session Laws.

Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Administration the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars $(\$ 25,000)$ for the 1992-93 fiscal year for the purposes of maintaining the above referenced lands.

Sec. 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 1992.
