A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT NEWBORNS WHO WERE EXPOSED TO ILLICIT DRUG OR ALCOHOL PRIOR TO BIRTH ARE NEGLECTED UNDER G.S. 7A-517.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 7A-517(21) reads as rewritten:

"(21) Neglected Juvenile. — A juvenile who does not receive proper care, supervision, or discipline from his parent, guardian, custodian, or caretaker; or who has been abandoned; or who is not provided necessary medical care or other remedial care recognized under State <a href="law">law</a>; or who lives in an environment injurious to his <a href="welfare">welfare</a>; or who has been placed for care or adoption in violation of <a href="law">law</a>; or any newborn infant whose body is shown through test to contain any amount of a controlled substance as defined in Article 5, Chapter 90, of the General Statutes, or a metabolite of such controlled substance, unless the presence of the controlled substance or the metabolite thereof is the result of medical treatment administered to the mother or the newborn infant; or any newborn infant who suffers from fetal alcohol syndrome or exhibits other physiological or neurological symptoms of drug or alcohol abuse by its mother; provided that no parent of such a newborn infant shall be subject to criminal investigation."

Sec. 2. Section 1 of this act becomes effective October 1, 1991.
