AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR MENTAL HEALTH STUDY

COMMISSION AND COALITION 2001 PLANS FOR MENTAL HEALTH,

DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES IN

NORTH CAROLINA.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Human Resources, Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse Services, the sum of thirty-two million nine hundred thousand five hundred thirty-seven dollars (\$32,900,537) for the 1992-93 fiscal year. These funds shall be allocated as follows to implement the Mental Health Study Commission and Coalition 2001 plans for mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse services in North Carolina:
