## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO INCREASE STATE EFFORT TO PREVENT DROPPING OUT OF 3 SCHOOL BEFORE GRADUATION.
- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. The State Board of Education shall encourage local units to 5 explore alternative programs with Senate Bill 2 flexibility under the Performance-Based 6 Accountability Program, to reduce dropouts. 7

The Department of Public Education and the State Board of 8 Sec. 2. Community Colleges shall adopt rules and procedures to provide more accurate, 9 comprehensive, and timely data on high school dropouts, alternative placements, 10 progress, and follow-through in alternative programs, shall require that local school 11 administrative units and the institutions of the Community Colleges system comply, and 12 shall use a standard measure of accountability. 13

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Sec. 3. The Department of Public Instruction shall:

- 15 (1) Conduct policy research on the issues of longer compulsory attendance, on the tying of the drivers license to staying in school, and 16 the limiting of after-school employment hours, from those states that 17 have implemented such changes; and 18
- Direct the Department of Public Instruction to reevaluate current 19 (2)attendance law to assess whether it is being adequately enforced. 20 21
  - Sec. 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 1991.
