1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO CHARGE NONRESIDENTS ATTENDING THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA SYSTEM TUITION THAT REPRESENTS THE TOTAL COST OF THEIR EDUCATION.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 116-144 reads as rewritten:

"§116-144. Higher tuition to be charged nonresidents.

The Board of Governors shall fix the tuition and required fees charged nonresidents of North Carolina who attend the institutions enumerated in G.S. 116-4 at rates higher than the rates charged residents of North Carolina and comparable to the rates charged nonresident students by comparable public institutions nationwide, that represent one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of their education, except that a person who serves as a graduate teaching assistant or graduate research assistant or in a similar instructional or research assignment and is at the same time enrolled as a graduate student in the same institution may, in the discretion of the Board of Governors, be charged a lower rate fixed by the Board, provided the rate is not lower than the North Carolina resident rate."

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification and applies to tuition charged for academic years beginning with the 1993-94 fiscal year.
