A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO INCREASE THE STANDARD OF NEED LEVEL FOR PAYMENTS UNDER THE MEDICAID AND AID TO FAMILIES WITH DEPENDENT CHILDREN PROGRAMS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Effective October 1, 1993, the maximum net family annual income eligibility standards for Medicaid and Aid to Families with Dependent Children, and the Standard of Need for Aid to Families with Dependent Children, shall be as follows:

5 *Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC); Aid to the Aged (AA); Aid to the
6 Blind (AB); and Aid to the Disabled (AD).

7 The payment level for Aid to Families with Dependent Children shall be thirty-six
8 percent (36%) of the standard of need.

9 These standards may be changed with the approval of the Director of the
10 Budget with the advice of the Advisory Budget Commission.

11 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
12 Human Resources the sum of seventeen million nine hundred twenty-five thousand two
13 hundred seventy-three dollars (\$17,925,273) for the 1993-94 fiscal year and the sum of
14 twenty-three million two hundred eighty-six thousand one hundred ninety-four dollars
15 (\$23,286,194), to be allocated to the Division of Medical Assistance and the Division of
16 Social Services to implement this act.

17 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
