Short Title: Off-Premises Keg Sales.

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO REGULATE OFF-PREMISE SALES OF MALT BEVERAGES IN
3 KEGS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. G.S. 18B-1006 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

6 "(1) Keg Sales of Malt Beverages. – As used in this subsection a 'keg' is a
7 container capable of holding at least 7.75 gallons of liquid. The sale of malt beverages
8 in kegs is subject to the following:

9 (1) Every keg of malt beverages offered for sale by an off-premises malt
10 beverage permittee shall be marked with a permanent identification
11 number and be tagged in a manner and with a label of a type approved
12 by the Commission identifying the keg. The tag must be supplied and
13 affixed to each keg, without fee, by the malt beverages wholesaler
14 providing the keg.

15 (2) The seller of the keg shall require the purchaser to complete a form
16 provided by the Commission including the purchaser's name, address,
17 and date of birth of the purchaser and the identification number of the
18 keg. The seller shall verify the purchaser's information by viewing the
19 purchaser's drivers license. The form must summarize the
20 requirements of this subsection, the penalties for violating any
21 provision of this section, and the penalties for providing malt
22 beverages to a minor. The seller shall retain the completed forms for a
23 period of one year and the completed records are public records.

1 (3) Any person who defaces or removes the identification tag provided by
2 the Commission on a keg or who possesses an unlabeled keg shall be
3 guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined or
4 imprisoned in the discretion of the court."

5 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1993.
