G.S. 143-53 reads as rewritten: "§ 143-53. Rules. The Secretary of Administration may adopt rules governing the following: 8 9 Prescribing the routine and procedures to be followed in canvassing bids and awarding contracts, and for reviewing decisions made 10 pursuant thereto, and the decision of the reviewing body shall be the final administrative review. 12 Prescribing routine for securing bids on items that do not exceed the 13 (2) 14 bid value benchmark established under the provisions of G.S. 143-15 53.1. Prescribing the terms and conditions under which agencies, with 16 (2a) respect to commodities covered by term contracts, may 17 Purchase a commodity off of a term contract subject to the 18 a. expenditure threshold established by the Secretary for the 19 20 commodity; and Make volume purchases, which exceed limits established by the b. Secretary, under separate contracts. 22

1		A commodity may be purchased off of the term contract pursuant
2		to this subdivision only if its purchase price is less than that
3		established for the item under the term contract. The maximum
4		expenditure threshold under sub-subdivision a. of this subdivision for
5		any commodity is five hundred dollars (\$500.00).
6		All purchases made pursuant to this subdivision shall be reported to
7		the Department in the manner required by the Secretary.

20	(8)	Providing conditions under which bids may be rejected in whole or in

22	(9)	Prescribing conditions under which information submitted by bidders
23	(4.0)	or suppliers may be considered proprietary or confidential.
24	(10)	Prescribing procedures for making purchases under programs
25		involving participation by two or more levels or agencies of
26	(1.1)	government, or otherwise with funds other than State-appropriated.
27	(11)	Prescribing procedures to encourage the purchase of North Carolina
28		farm products, and products of North Carolina manufacturing
