1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE CAMPAIGN LAWS TO CHANGE THE SYSTEM OF  
3 POSTPRIMARY REPORTING FOR STATEWIDE NONJUDICIAL  
4 CANDIDATES.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Section 1. G.S. 163-278.9(a)(3) reads as rewritten:

7 "(3) Postprimary Report(s).—Report(s) for Nonstatewide Candidates and  
8 Judicial Candidates. – The treasurer shall file a report with the Board  
9 no later than the 30th day after the primary election if the candidate  
10 was eliminated in the primary. If there is a second primary, the  
11 treasurer shall file a report with the Board no later than the 30th day  
12 after the second primary election if the candidate was eliminated in the  
13 second primary. This subdivision applies only to candidates for  
14 offices not elected statewide and to candidates for all judicial offices,  
15 regardless of whether elected statewide."

16 Sec. 2. G.S. 163-278.9(a) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:

17 "(3a) Postprimary Report(s) for Statewide Nonjudicial Candidates. – The  
18 treasurer shall file a report with the board no later than the 60th day  
19 before the general election. This subdivision applies only to  
20 candidates for offices that are elected statewide, excluding all judicial  
21 offices. An individual who was defeated in a primary election is a  
22 candidate for purposes of the reporting required by this subdivision."

1           Sec. 3. This act becomes effective January 1, 1995, and applies to all  
2 primaries and elections occurring on or after that date.
