A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT A RECOMMENDATION OF THE GOVERNMENT  
PERFORMANCE AUDIT COMMITTEE TO DIRECT THE GOVERNOR TO  
STUDY BUTNER PUBLIC SAFETY.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. The Governor shall examine public safety services in Butner. The study shall provide a detailed evaluation of the following options:

- (1) G.S. 153A-301 should be amended to allow counties to create Public Safety Districts, and the creation of such a district in Durham and Granville Counties to serve Butner, which district could levy local property taxes in unincorporated areas for public safety services;
- (2) Incorporation of Butner; or
- (3) No change.

Sec. 2. The results of the study shall be reported to the General Assembly no later than convening of the 1994 Regular Session of the 1993 General Session. The study should address:

- (1) Unique needs of the State institutions;
- (2) Needs of local residents;
- (3) Services that would be provided by an incorporated Town of Butner, such as fire, police protection, water, and sewer;
- (4) Services that would be provided by a stand-alone public safety district;
- (5) The impact on other local governments of incorporating Butner or establishing a public safety district;
- (6) The current cost to local residents;

- 1           (7)    The tax base; and  
2           (8)    Other relevant factors.  
3           Sec. 3. The Governor should provide participation in the study to Granville  
4 and Durham Counties, to local residents, and to federal and State institutions at Butner.  
5           Sec. 4. This act is effective upon ratification.
