A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT A RECOMMENDATION OF THE GOVERNMENT
PERFORMANCE AUDIT COMMITTEE TO CREATE THE STATE WORKERS'
COMPENSATION OFFICE AND TO CONSOLIDATE THE ADMINISTRATION
OF THE STATE WORKERS' COMPENSATION PROGRAM.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
Article to read:

"ARTICLE 64.

"STATE WORKERS' COMPENSATION OFFICE.

"§ 143-590. State Workers' Compensation Office established; duties.

There is hereby established the State Workers' Compensation Office (hereinafter referred to as 'Office'). The Office is established to consolidate the administration of the State Workers' Compensation Program. The Office shall administer the State Workers' Compensation Program in accordance with rules and procedures to be adopted by the Office, including rules and procedures related to the following:

- (1) Processing all State employee claims; including employees in the judicial, legislative, and executive branches of government and all public school employees paid from State funds;

1 (2) Authorizing payment of benefits to employees pursuant to the
2 Workers' Compensation Act and the rules and regulations of the North
3 Carolina Industrial Commission; and

4 (3) Settling workers' compensation claims made against the State."

5 Sec. 2. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the Office created in
6 Section 1 of this act shall begin processing State workers' compensation claims no later
7 than December 31, 1994, and that total claims processing will be phased in over the
8 next two years following that date.

9 Sec. 3. The Office of State Personnel (OSP) in conjunction with the Office of
10 State Budget and Management and the Office of the State Controller, shall develop an
11 implementation plan to consolidate the central administration of claims processing of
12 the State workers' compensation claims in the Office created in Section 1 of this act.
13 The plan shall comply with the time schedule established under Section 2 of this act and
14 shall address, but not be limited to, the following elements:

15 (1) Staffing and equipment needs of the Office;

16 (2) Automated systems requirements;

17 (3) Space requirements;

18 (4) Operational responsibilities remaining with the agencies;

19 (5) Transfer of agency positions to the Office;

20 (6) Presentation of the plan to the agencies;

21 (7) Appropriations required to implement the plan; and

22 (8) Organizational placement of the Office.

23 OSP shall complete the implementation plan by February 1, 1994, and deliver
24 it to the General Assembly on or before the first day of the 1994 General Assembly by
25 filing the report with the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro
26 Tempore of the Senate, the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations,
27 and the Fiscal Research Division.

28 Sec. 3. (a). The Office of State Personnel, Department of Administration,
29 shall fund this act within funds available to it.

30 (b) Nothing in this act obligates the General Assembly to appropriate any funds
31 to implement this act.

32 Sec. 4. Section 1 of this act becomes effective July 1, 1994. The remainder
33 of this act is effective upon ratification.
