A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION TO CONTINUE THE STUDY OF THE STATE REAL PROPERTY TRANSFERS STUDY COMMISSION.

Whereas, the State Real Property Transfers Study Commission identified several areas which needed additional studying, and several additional areas which needed studying, including: (i) further study of agencies exempt from the requirements of Chapter 146 of the General Statutes and approval by the Council of State, (ii) the planning for future State space needs, (iii) the alternatives for funding and financing these needs, and (iv) the role of the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations in the State's real property process; but these areas could not be examined in the time available to the study; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

 Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission may continue and expand the study begun by the State Real Property Transfers Study Commission, created by Section 19 of Chapter 900 of the 1991 Session Laws (Regular Session, 1992), to include:

- (1) All acquisitions, dispositions, or exchanges of real property by the State, including those State agencies presently exempt from the requirements of Chapter 146 of the General Statutes or the approval of their real property transactions by the Council of State, or both;
- (2) The planning for the future space needs of the State;
