A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO CHANGE PROSECUTORIAL DISTRICT 19A AND TO CREATE PROSECUTORIAL DISTRICT 19C, TO CONFORM TO THE COMPARABLE DISTRICT COURT AND SUPERIOR COURT DISTRICTS 19A, 19B, AND 19C.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Effective January 1, 1995, G.S. 7A-60(a1) reads as rewritten:

"(a1) The counties of the State are organized into prosecutorial districts, and each district has the counties and the number of full-time assistant district attorneys set forth in the following table:

42 Sec. 2. The district attorney for newly created Prosecutorial District 19C
 43 shall be elected in the general election of 1994 for a four-year term beginning January 1,
 44 1995.

1 Sec. 3. The district attorney for Prosecutorial District 19A shall be elected in
2 the general election of 1994 for a four-year term beginning January 1, 1995. The eight
3 assistant district attorney positions currently serving Prosecutorial District 19A shall be
4 allotted as follows: four assistant district attorney positions to newly created
5 Prosecutorial District 19C, and four assistant district attorney positions to Prosecutorial
6 District 19A.

7 Sec. 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Administrative
8 Office of the Courts the sum of one hundred twelve thousand nine hundred ninety-nine
9 dollars (\$112,999) for the 1994-95 fiscal year to implement this act.

10 Sec. 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
