Article 39 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by 8 adding a new section to read: 9 "§ 14-316.2. Repeated failure of parent to adequately supervise minor. 10 A parent or guardian who knowingly and repeatedly allows the parent's child, 11 or the guardian's ward, who is under 18 years of age to: 12 Loiter or wander about in a public place between 1:00 a.m. and sunrise 13 (1) while unaccompanied by an adult, unless the minor is engaged in 14 lawful and gainful employment or is waiting for transportation to 15 school, or 16 Enter barrooms while unaccompanied by an adult 17 (2) shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. 18 For purposes of this section, 'public place' is defined in G.S. 14-204.1." 19 (b) Sec. 2. This act becomes effective January 1, 1995, and applies to offenses 20
