4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. G.S. 15A-1340.10, as enacted by Section 1 of Chapter 538 of the
6 1993 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

7 "§ 15A-1340.10. Applicability of structured sentencing.

This Article applies to criminal offenses in North Carolina, other than impaired driving under G.S. 20-138.1 that occur on or after ~~January 1, 1995~~ July 1, 1994."

10 Sec. 2. Section 56 of Chapter 538 of the 1993 Session Laws reads as
11 rewritten:

12 "Sec. 56. This act becomes effective January 1, 1995, July 1, 1994, and applies only
13 to offenses occurring on or after that date. Prosecutions for, or sentences based on,
14 offenses occurring before the effective date of this act are not abated or affected by the
15 repeal or amendment in this act of any statute, and the statutes that would be applicable
16 to those prosecutions or sentences but for the provisions of this act remain applicable to
17 those prosecutions or sentences."

18 Sec. 3. Section 1359 of Chapter 539 of the 1993 Session Laws reads as
19 rewritten:

20 "Sec. 1359. This act becomes effective January 1, 1995, July 1, 1994, and applies to
21 offenses occurring on or after that date. Prosecutions for offenses committed before the
22 effective date of this act are not abated or affected by this act, and the statutes that
23 would be applicable but for this act remain applicable to those prosecutions."

1 Sec. 4. G.S. 15A-1371(a1), as enacted by Section 22 of Chapter 538 of the
2 1993 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

3 "(a1) A prisoner serving a term of life imprisonment is eligible for parole after
4 serving 25 years. This subsection applies to offenses committed on and or after January
5 1, 1995. July 1, 1994."

6 Sec. 5. This act is effective upon ratification.
