A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER PENALTY A  
2 PERSON SELLING OR GIVING ALCOHOL TO AN UNDERAGE PERSON  
3 SHALL HAVE HIS DRIVERS LICENSE SUSPENDED FOR ONE YEAR.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Section 1. Chapter 18B of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new  
7 section to read:

8 "**§ 18B-302.1. License revocations for selling or giving alcoholic beverages to**  
9 **underage person.**

10 When a person is convicted of violating G.S. 18B-302(a)(1) or G.S. 18B-302(a)(2), in  
11 addition to any other action taken by the court, the court shall notify the Division of  
12 Motor Vehicles of the conviction, pursuant to G.S. 18B-302(g).

13 Upon receipt of a conviction report issued under this section, the Division of Motor  
14 Vehicles shall revoke the person's license as required by G.S. 20-17.3."

15 Sec. 2. G.S. 20-17.3 reads as rewritten:

16 "**§ 20-17.3. Revocation for sellers and providers to underage persons and underage**  
17 **purchasers of alcohol.**

1       The Division shall revoke for one year the driver's license of any person who has been  
2 convicted of violating any of the following:

3           (1)    G.S. 18B-302(c)(1), (e), or (f); ~~or~~

4           (2)    G.S. 18B-302(b), if the violation occurred while the person was  
5                purchasing or attempting to purchase an alcoholic ~~beverage.~~ beverage;  
6                or

7           (3)    G.S. 18B-302(a)(1) or (a)(2).

8 If the person's license is currently suspended or revoked, then the revocation under this  
9 section shall begin at the termination of that revocation."

10           Sec. 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 1995.
