1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO RENAME THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AS THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND LABOR, AND TO TRANSFER MOST FUNCTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR TO THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND LABOR, AND TO DIRECT THE SECRETARY OF COMMERCE TO ELIMINATE FIFTY PERCENT OF POSITIONS IN THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF LABOR UPON TRANSFER.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

- Section 1. (a) The Department of Commerce is renamed the Department of Commerce and Labor.
- (b) The Revisor of Statutes shall change any references in the General Statutes to the "Department of Commerce" to the "Department of Commerce and Labor". The Revisor of Statutes shall change any references to the "Secretary of Commerce" or the "Secretary of the Department of Commerce" to the "Secretary of Commerce and Labor" or the "Secretary of the Department of Commerce and Labor" respectively.
- (c) The statutory authority, powers, duties and functions, records, personnel, property, unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations or other funds, including the functions of budgeting and purchasing, of the Department of Labor to the Department of Commerce and Labor, except that the position of the Commissioner of Labor and one

clerical assistant are not transferred. The Commissioner of Labor shall have the powers and duties provided by G.S. 143A-68.

- (d) The Revisor of Statutes shall change any references in the General Statutes to the "Department of Labor" to the "Department of Commerce and Labor". The Revisor of Statutes shall change any references to the "Commissioner of Labor" to the "Secretary of Commerce and Labor". This subsection does not apply to G.S. 147-11.1.
- Sec. 2. The Secretary of Commerce shall develop a plan for the elimination of fifty percent (50%) of the positions within the office of the Commissioner of Labor and shall implement that plan upon transfer of most functions of the Department of Labor to the Department of Commerce and Labor as pursuant to Section 1 of this act.
  - Sec. 3. G.S. 20-79.5(a) reads as rewritten:
- "(a) Plates. The State government officials listed in this section are eligible for a special registration plate under G.S. 20-79.4. The plate shall bear the number designated in the following table for the position held by the official.
