1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE STATUTES SO AS TO STREAMLINE THE
3	OPERATIONS OF THE STATE EDUCATION AGENCY.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. Article 1 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by
6	adding a new section to read:
7	" <u>§ 115C-1.1. State governance of the public school system.</u>
8	Because the executive power of the State is vested in the Governor, the General
9	Assembly believes that, ultimately, the Governor is responsible for the general
10	supervision of the free public school system in North Carolina. The Governor appoints
11	and guides the members of the State Board of Education which then supervises and
12	administers the public school system. The Superintendent of Public Instruction serves as
13	secretary and chief administrative officer of the State Board. As secretary and chief
14	administrative officer, the Superintendent manages on a day-to-day basis the
15	administration of the free public school system, subject to the direction, control, and
16	approval of the State Board."
17	Sec. 2. G.S. 115C-19 reads as rewritten:

13	(1)	To organize and establish a Department of Public Instruction which
14		shall include such divisions and departments as are-the State Board
15		considers necessary for supervision and administration of the public
16		school system, to administer the funds for the operation of the Department of
17		Public Instruction, and to enter into contracts for the operations of the
18		Department of Public Instruction. <u>system</u> . All appointments of
19		administrative and supervisory personnel to the staff of the Department
20		of Public Instruction are subject to the approval of the State Board of
21		Education, which may terminate these appointments for cause in
22		conformity with Chapter 126 of the General Statutes, the State
23		Personnel System.
24	(2)	To keep the public informed as to the problems and needs of the public
25		schools by constant contact with all school administrators and teachers,
26		by his-personal appearance at public gatherings, and by information
27		furnished to the press of the State.
28	(3)	To report biennially to the Governor 30 days prior to each regular
29		session of the General Assembly, such report to include information and
30		statistics of the public schools, with recommendations for their
31		improvement and for such changes in the school law as shall occur to him.

33	(4)	To have printed and distributed such educational bulletins as he shall
34		deem are necessary for the professional improvement of teachers and for
35		the cultivation of public sentiment for public education, and to have
36		printed all forms necessary and proper for the administration of the
37		Department of Public Instruction.
38	(5)	To have under his direction, in his capacity as the constitutional head of the
39		public school system, manage all those matters relating to the supervision
40		and administration of the public school system. system that the State
41		Board delegates to the Superintendent of Public Instruction.
42	(6)	To create a special fund within the Department of Public Instruction to
43		manage funds received as grants from nongovernmental sources in

The Superintendent may accept grants and gifts from corporations and other sources made in support of public education and may hold and disburse such funds, in accordance with the purposes, conditions, and limitations associated with such grants and gifts. Any special fund created pursuant to this subdivision shall be subject to audit by the State AuditorEffective July 1, 1995, this special fund is transferred to the State Board of Education and shall be administered by the State Board in accordance with G.S. 115C-410. To have solely under his direction and control all matters relating to provision of staff services and support to the State Board of Education, including implementation of federal programs on behalf of the State Board of Education, except as otherwise provided in the Current Operations Appropriations Act.

35		of conveyance, leases, and contracts affecting real estate, title to which
36		is held by the Board, and all contracts of the Board required to be in
37		writing and under seal, shall be executed in the name of the Board by
38		the chairman and attested by the secretary; and proof of the execution, if
39		required or desired, may be had as provided by law for the proof of
40		corporate instruments.
41	(8)	To attend all meetings of the Board and to keep the minutes of the
42		proceedings of the Board in a well-bound and suitable book, which
43		minutes shall be approved by the Board prior to its adjournment; and, as

1	soon thereafter as possible, to furnish to each member of the Board a
2	copy of said minutes.
3	(9) To perform such other duties as the Board may assign to him from time
4	to time."
5	Sec. 4. Article 5 of Chapter 143A of the General Statutes is amended by
6	adding three new sections to read:
7	" <u>§ 143A-39. Creation.</u>
8	There is hereby created a Department of Public Instruction. The head of the
9	Department of Public Instruction is the State Board of Education. Any provision of G.S.
10	143A-9 to the contrary notwithstanding, the appointment of the State Board of Education
11	shall be as prescribed in Article IV, Section 4(1) of the Constitution.
12	"§ 143A-40. State Board of Education; transfer of powers and duties to State
13	Board.
14	The State Board of Education shall have all powers and duties conferred on the Board
15	by this Article, delegated to the Board by the Governor, and conferred by the Constitution
16	and laws of this State.
17	" <u>§ 143A-42.</u> Superintendent of Public Instruction; creation; transfer of powers and
18	duties.
19	The office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, as provided for by Article III,
20	Section 7 of the Constitution, and the Department of Public Instruction are transferred to
21	the Department of Public Instruction. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall be
22	the Secretary and Chief Administrative Officer of the State Board of Education, and shall
23	have all powers and duties conferred by the Constitution, by the State Board of
24	Education, Chapter 115C of the General Statutes, and the laws of this State."
25	Sec. 5. The State Board of Education shall review all State laws and policies
26	governing the public school system to ensure their compliance with the intent of this act
27	to restore constitutional authority to the State Board. The Board shall complete this
28	review and make any recommendations for additional statutory changes to the General
29	Assembly by May 1, 1995.
30	Sec. 6. This act is effective upon ratification.
