8	" <u>§ 20-175.6. Limited use of golf carts on highways.</u>	
9	<u>(a)</u> <u>G</u>	olf carts may be used on the highways under the following conditions:
10	<u>(1</u>	<u>) They are operated only by the owner;</u>
11	<u>(2</u>	<u>) They are operated within two miles of the owner's residence to go to</u>
12		and from golf courses and beaches;
13	<u>(3</u>) They are operated during the hours between one-half hour after sunrise
14		and one-half hour before sunset;
15	<u>(4</u>) They have functioning braking systems in proper working order;
16	<u>(5</u>) They may not be operated on interstate highways and may be operated
17		on a primary highway only while crossing that highway at an
18		intersection approved by and marked with traffic-warning signs
19		provided by the Department of Transportation.

(b) While operating a golf cart on the highways pursuant to subsection (a) of this
section, the owner of the golf cart is subject to all the laws, ordinances, regulations,
rights, and responsibilities which would otherwise apply to a pedestrian and to local
ordinances regulating use of a golf cart, but is not subject to Part 10 of this Article or any
other law, ordinance, or regulation otherwise applicable to motor vehicles."
Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
