8	(a) The State Board of Education shall annually identify low performing local
9	school administrative units. Low performing local school administrative units are units
10	in which (i) student performance measures are substantially below, as defined by the
11	State Board, those reported by other units in the State, and (ii) student dropout rates are
12	substantially higher than, as defined by the State Board, the average statewide rate.
13	(b) Prior to identifying a local school administrative unit as low performing, the
14	State Board shall select persons to serve on an assistance team who can provide the types
15	of expertise the local school administrative unit needs. The State Board shall select an
