**A BILL TO BE ENTITLED**

**AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO PROVIDE DIAGNOSTIC AND  
TREATMENT SERVICES FOR CHILDREN WITH CRANIOFACIAL  
ANOMALIES INCLUDING CLEFT LIP/PALATE.**

Whereas, approximately 200 infants are born in North Carolina each year with craniofacial anomalies including cleft lip/palate; and

Whereas, it is critical that prompt and comprehensive diagnostic and treatment services be provided to these children to maximize their health and development; and

Whereas, children who are uninsured or underinsured are generally referred to the Craniofacial Center of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill; and

Whereas, the Center does not have the financial resources to meet the demand for these critical services; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources, Division of Maternal and Child Health, the sum of three hundred forty-three thousand dollars (\$343,000) for the 1995-96 fiscal year and the sum of three hundred forty-three thousand dollars (\$343,000) for the 1996-97 fiscal year to provide comprehensive diagnostic and treatment services for uninsured and underinsured children in North Carolina with craniofacial anomalies including cleft lip/palate.

1           Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995.
