A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE APPOINTMENT OF A NEW SPECIAL SUPERIOR
COURT JUDGE AND TO AUTHORIZE A NEW DISTRICT COURT JUDGE AND
A NEW ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEY FOR A DRUG COURT TO BE
ESTABLISHED IN DISTRICT 9.

Section 1. G.S. 7A-45.1(a) reads as rewritten:

"(a) Effective November 1, 1993, the Governor may appoint two special superior court judges to serve terms expiring December 31, 1998. Effective July 1, 1995, the Governor may appoint an additional special superior court judge to serve a term expiring December 31, 1998. Successors to the special superior court judges appointed pursuant to this subsection shall be appointed to four-year terms. A special judge takes the same oath of office and is subject to the same requirements and disabilities as are or may be prescribed by law for regular judges of the superior court, save the requirement of residence in a particular district."

Sec. 2. G.S. 7A-133 reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-133. Numbers of judges by districts; numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, by counties.

Section 4 of this act becomes effective October 1, 1995. The remainder of this act becomes effective July 1, 1995.
