1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO APPOINT PERSONS TO PUBLIC OFFICE UPON THE
3 RECOMMENDATION OF THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
4 REPRESENTATIVES.

Whereas, G.S. 120-121 authorizes the General Assembly to make certain appointments upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
Whereas, the Speaker of the House of Representatives has made recommendations; Now, therefore,

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Section 1. Ms. Susan Goldstone of Forsyth County is appointed to the
7 Acupuncture Licensing Board for a term expiring June 30, 1999.

8 Sec. 2. Ms. Lois Jean O'Keefe of Carteret County, Mr. Robert J. Beason of
9 New Hanover County, Mr. Daniel Martin, III of New Hanover County, and Mr. H.
10 Edward Browning of Washington County are appointed to the North Carolina Aquariums
11 Commission for terms expiring July 1, 2000.

12 Sec. 3. Mrs. Anne Shumaker of Franklin County (parent member) is appointed
13 to the Child Day Care Commission for a term expiring June 30, 1998.

1 Sec. 4. Mrs. Ann Boney of Wake County is appointed to the North Carolina
2 Board of Dietetics/Nutrition for a term expiring June 30, 1998.

3 Sec. 5. Mr. McKeithan Jones of Robeson County and Mr. Joe Hege of
4 Davidson County are appointed to the Southeastern North Carolina Farmers Market
5 Commission for terms expiring July 1, 1999.

6 Sec. 6. Mr. Joseph Meacci of Moore County is appointed to the Board of
7 Trustees of the Teachers' and State Employees' Comprehensive Major Medical Plan for a
8 term expiring June 30, 1998.

9 Sec. 7. Ms. Suzanne Freeman of Mecklenburg County and Ms. Polly Godwin
10 of Wake County are appointed to the North Carolina Center for Nursing Board of
11 Directors for terms expiring June 30, 1999.

12 Sec. 8. Dr. G. Robert Horton of Moore County and Ms. Drane McCall of
13 Forsyth County are appointed to the North Carolina Parks and Recreation Authority for
14 terms expiring June 30, 1998.

15 Sec. 9. Mr. Patrick Joyce of Carteret County is appointed to the North
16 Carolina State Ports Authority for a term expiring June 30, 1998.

17 Sec. 10. Mr. Tobin Henry of Mecklenburg County is appointed to the Private
18 Protective Services Board for a term expiring June 30, 1999.

19 Sec. 11. Mr. Tom Keith of Cumberland County is appointed to the North
20 Carolina Appraisal Board for a term expiring June 30, 1999.

21 Sec. 12. Mr. Paul Powell of Wake County is appointed to the Rules Review
22 Commission for a term expiring June 30, 1998.

23 Sec. 13. Mr. Graham Cawthorne, Jr. (Public, nonsoils) of Wake County is
24 appointed to the North Carolina Board for Licensing of Soil Scientists for a term expiring
25 June 30, 1999.

26 Sec. 14. Ms. Jeannie Metcalf of Forsyth County is appointed to the North
27 Carolina Teaching Fellows Commission for a term expiring June 30, 2000.

28 Sec. 15. Mr. Charles T. Wilson, Jr. of Durham County is appointed to the
29 State Building Commission for a term expiring June 30, 1999.

30 Sec. 15.1. Ms. Peggy Pruett of Forsyth County is appointed to the North
31 Carolina State Board of Therapeutic Recreation Certification for a term expiring June 30,
32 1999.

33 Sec. 16. G.S. 93E-1-5(a) reads as rewritten:

34 "(a) There is created the North Carolina Appraisal Board for the purposes set forth
35 in this Chapter. The Board shall consist of seven members. The Governor shall appoint
36 five members of the Board, and the General Assembly shall appoint two members in
37 accordance with G.S. 120-121, one upon the recommendation of the President Pro
38 Tempore of the Senate and one upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of
39 Representatives. Each member appointed by the Governor shall be appointed from a
40 different congressional district. The appointee recommended by the Speaker of the House
41 of Representatives and the appointees of the Governor shall be persons who have been
42 engaged in the business of real estate appraising in this State for at least five years
43 immediately preceding their appointment and are also State-licensed or State-certified

1 real estate appraisers. No more than ~~three~~four of the appointees may be members of the
2 same appraiser trade organization, group, or committee at any one time. The appointee
3 recommended by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall be a person not involved
4 directly or indirectly in the real estate, real estate appraisal, or the real estate lending
5 industry. Members of the Board shall serve three-year terms, so staggered that the terms
6 of three members expire in one year, the terms of two members expire in the next year,
7 and the terms of two members expire in the third year of each three-year period. The
8 members of the Board shall elect one of their members to serve as chairman of the Board
9 for a term of one year. The Governor may remove any member of the Board appointed by
10 the Governor for misconduct, incompetency, or neglect of duty. The General Assembly
11 may remove any member appointed by it for the same reasons. Successors shall be
12 appointed by the appointing authority making the original appointment. All vacancies
13 occurring on the Board shall be filled, for the unexpired term, by the appointing authority
14 making the original appointment. Vacancies in appointments made by the General
15 Assembly shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 120-122. Initial terms of office
16 commence July 1, 1994."

17 Sec. 16.1. G.S. 143B-313.2(a) reads as rewritten:

18 "(a) Membership. – The North Carolina Parks and Recreation Authority shall
19 consist of ~~nine~~11 members. The members shall include persons who are knowledgeable
20 about park and recreation issues in North Carolina or with expertise in finance. Three
21 members shall be appointed by the Governor, ~~three~~four members shall be appointed by
22 the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of
23 Representatives in accordance with G.S. 120-121, and ~~three~~four members shall be
24 appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the President Pro
25 Tempore of the Senate in accordance with G.S. 120-121. The members shall serve at the
26 pleasure of the appointing authority. The Governor shall appoint one of the members to
27 be Chair of the North Carolina Parks and Recreation Authority. Vacancies shall be
28 appointed by the original appointing authority, and the term shall be for the balance of the
29 unexpired term. The North Carolina Parks and Recreation Authority shall meet at a time
30 and place as designated by the Chair, but no less frequently than quarterly."

31 Sec. 17. Except as otherwise provided, all appointments made by this act are
32 for terms commencing upon ratification.

33 Sec. 18. This act is effective upon ratification.
