1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH AND APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR A JUVENILE
3	ASSESSMENT CENTER PROJECT AND TO ESTABLISH AN ADVISORY
4	BOARD TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING THE PROJECT.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. (a) The Administrative Office of the Courts, in collaboration with
7	the Chief Court Counselor of District Court District 12, the Cumberland County
8	Department of Social Services, and the appropriate local school administrative units,
9	shall develop and implement a Juvenile Assessment Center Project in District Court
10	District 12. The purpose of the Project is to facilitate efficient prevention and
11	intervention service delivery to juveniles who are (i) alleged to be delinquent or
12	undisciplined and have been taken into custody or (ii) at risk of becoming delinquent or
13	undisciplined because they have behavioral problems and have committed delinquent acts
14	even though they have not been taken into custody. The Project shall assist these
15	juveniles, by providing a centralized point of intake and assessment for the juveniles, by
16	addressing the educational, emotional, and physical needs of the juveniles, and by
17	providing juveniles with an atmosphere for learning personal responsibility, self-respect,
18	and respect for others. The Administrative Office of the Courts shall consider the

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1	recommendations of the Juvenile Assessment Advisory Board in developing and		
2	implementing the Project.		
3	(b) The Project shall be modeled after the Juvenile Assessment Center in		
4	Hillsborough County, Florida, and shall:		
5	(1)	Identify those juveniles who are alleged to be delinquent or	
6		undisciplined or are at risk of becoming delinquent or undisciplined;	
7	(2)	Evaluate the educational, emotional, and physical needs of the juveniles	
8		identified and determine whether the juveniles have problems related to	
9		substance abuse, depression, or other emotional conditions;	
10	(3)	Develop in-depth and comprehensive assessment plans for the juveniles	
11		identified that recommend appropriate treatment, counseling, and	
12		disposition of the juveniles; and	
13	(4)	Provide services to juveniles identified and their families through	
14		collaboration with public and private resources, including local law	
15		enforcement, parents' organizations, the Fayetteville Chamber of	
16		Commerce, and county and community programs and organizations that	
17		provide substance abuse treatment and child and family counseling.	
18	Section 2. (a) There is established the Juvenile Assessment Advisory Board to		
19	make recommendations to the Administrative Office of the Courts regarding the		
20	development ar	nd operations of the Project. The Board shall consist of 13 members,	
21	including:		
22	(1)	The director of the Department of Social Services of Cumberland	
23		County, or the director's designee.	
24	(2)	A representative from the local mental health area authority of	
25		Cumberland County.	
26	(3)	A member of the Cumberland County Board of Education.	
27	(4)	The sheriff of Cumberland County, or the sheriff's designee.	
28	(5)	The chief of police of the Fayetteville Police Department, or the	
29		designee of the chief of police.	
30	(6)	A judge of District Court District 12.	
31	(7)	A juvenile court counselor from District Court District 12.	
32	(8)	The director of the Guardian Ad Litem program in Cumberland County,	
33		or the director's designee.	
34	(9)	The director of the Health Department of Cumberland County, or the	
35		director's designee.	
36	(10)	Two public members appointed by the Fayetteville City Council.	
37	(11)	Two public members appointed by the Board of County Commissioners	
38		of Cumberland County.	
39	(b)	The members of the Board shall, within 30 days after the initial	
40	appointment is made, meet and elect one member as chair. The Board shall meet at least		
41	once a month at the call of the chair, and a quorum of the Board shall consist of a		
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42 majority of its members.

The Board of County Commissioners of Cumberland County shall 1 (c) 2 provide necessary clerical and professional assistance to the Board. 3 Initial appointments shall be made by August 1, 1997, and all terms (d)4 shall expire June 30, 1999. 5 Section 3. The Administrative Office of the Courts shall evaluate the Project 6 and report to the Cochairs of the House and Senate Appropriations Subcommittees on 7 Justice and Public Safety and to the Fiscal Research Division on October 1, 1997, March 8 1, 1998, and October 1, 1998, on the progress of the development and implementation of 9 the Project. The October 1998 report shall include recommendations on whether the 10 Project should be continued and, if so, the extent to which it should be continued, why it should be continued, and the costs associated with continuing the Project. If the 11 12 Administrative Office of the Courts recommends that the Project not be continued, it 13 shall provide the reasons for the recommendation. Section 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Administrative 14 15 Office of the Courts the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the 1997-98 fiscal year and the sum of eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) for the 1998-99 fiscal year to 16 17 fund the Juvenile Assessment Project authorized by this act. These funds shall be 18 matched by local funds on the basis of one dollar (\$1.00) of local funds for every three 19 dollars (\$3.00) of State funds.

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Section 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 1997, and expires June 30, 1999.
