1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE LICENSURE OF ESTHETICIANS BY THE
3	STATE BOARD OF COSMETIC ART EXAMINERS.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 88-1 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 88-1. Practice of cosmetology regulated; practice of esthetics regulated; permits
7	for operation of cosmetic art shops.
8	(a) No person or combination of persons shall, for pay or reward, either directly or
9	indirectly, practice or attempt to practice cosmetic art as hereinafter defined in the State
10	of North Carolina without a certificate of registration, license, either as a registered an
11	apprentice or as a registered "cosmetologist," cosmetologist, issued pursuant to the
12	provisions of this Chapter by the State Board of Cosmetic Art Examiners. The practice of
13	cosmetic art shall not be performed outside of a licensed and regularly inspected beauty
14	establishment, unless the practice is allowed under G.S. 88-7.1 or occurs in a barbershop
15	licensed under Chapter 86A of the General Statutes. A person who practices cosmetic art
16	in a barbershop must comply with G.S. 86A-15.
17	(a1) No person shall, for pay or reward, either directly or indirectly, practice or
18	attempt to practice esthetics or teach or attempt to teach esthetics as defined in this
19	Chapter without a license issued by the State Board of Cosmetic Art Examiners.

The operator of a cosmetic art shop, beauty parlor or hairdressing 1 (b) establishment may employ unlicensed personnel to do shampooing only, where the 2 3 shampooing is done under the supervision of a registered licensed cosmetologist. As used 4 in this paragraph, 'shampooing' includes only the application of shampoo to hair and the 5 removal of the shampoo from the hair, and does not include any arranging, dressing, 6 waving, marcelling or other treatment of hair. This paragraph does not apply to barbershops. This paragraph shall not apply to the following counties: Guilford, 7 8 Mecklenburg, Onslow, Richmond, Sampson.

9 On and after February 1, 1976, any person, firm or corporation, before (c) 10 establishing or opening a cosmetic art shop not heretofore licensed by the State Board of Cosmetic Art, shall make application to the Board, on forms to be furnished by the 11 12 Board, for a permit to operate a cosmetic art shop. As a part of the application, the person, firm, or corporation shall list all registered-licensed cosmetologists who will 13 14 practice cosmetic art in that cosmetic art shop and shall identify each cosmetologist as an 15 employee or a booth renter. The shop of such applicant shall be inspected and approved by the State Board of Cosmetic Art by an agent designated for such purpose by the Board 16 17 before such cosmetic art shop shall be opened for business. It shall be unlawful to open a 18 new cosmetic art shop for the practice of cosmetology until such shop has been inspected, as heretofore required, and determined by the Board to be in compliance with the 19 20 requirements set forth in this Chapter. Upon the determination by the Board that the 21 applicant has complied with the requirements of this Chapter, the Board shall issue to such-the applicant a permit to operate a cosmetic art shop. A fee of twenty-five dollars 22 23 (\$25.00) shall be paid to the Board for the inspection of a cosmetic art shop. Such-The fee 24 must accompany the application for a permit to operate a cosmetic art shop at the time such the application is filed with the Board. 25

(d) All cosmetic art shops in operation as of February 1, 1976, shall be required to
make application to the Board of Cosmetic Art, on forms supplied by the Board, for a
permit to operate. The fee required for such-the permit shall be three dollars (\$3.00) per
active booth in said-the shop.

30 All permits shall be renewed as of the first day of February of each and every (e) year, and the fee for annual renewal of cosmetic art shop permits shall be as set forth in 31 G.S. 88-21. As a part of the renewal of the permit, the person, firm, or corporation shall 32 33 list all registered licensed cosmetologists who currently practice cosmetic art in that cosmetic art shop and shall identify each cosmetologist as an employee or a booth renter. 34 35 No permit or certificate-license shall be transferable from one location to another or from one owner to another at the same location. Each cosmetic art shop permit shall be 36 37 conspicuously posted within such-the cosmetic art shop for which same-the permit is 38 issued."

39 Section 2. Chapter 88 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new40 section to read:

1	Section 7. G.S. 88-24 reads as rewritten:
2	"§ 88-24. Posting of certificates. licenses; permits.
3	Every holder of a certificate of registration shall display it in a conspicuous place
4	adjacent to or near his, or her work chair.
5	(a) Every apprentice, cosmetologist, esthetician, and esthetician teacher licensed
6	under this Chapter shall display the license issued by the Board within the shop or school
7	where the person works.
8	(b) Every permit to operate a cosmetic art shop shall be conspicuously posted in
9	the shop for which it is issued."
10	Section 8. G.S. 88-25 reads as rewritten:
11	"§ 88-25. Annual renewal of certificates <u>licenses</u> and permits.
12	(a) Every registered cosmetologist who continues in active practice or service shall
13	renew his or her certificate of registration-the license issued by the Board on or before
14	October 1, 1986, and every three years thereafter. The certificate-license shall expire on
15	the first day of November in the year in which the renewal is due. Every registered
16	apprentice who continues in active practice or service shall annually, on or before
17	October 1 of each year, renew his or her certificate of registration which the license issued
18	by the Board that has not been renewed prior to, or during, the month of October in any
19	year, and which shall expire on the first day of November in that year. A registered
20	cosmetologist, or a registered an apprentice whose certificate of registration license has
21	expired may have his or her certificate-the license restored immediately upon payment of
22	the required restoration fee. Any registered-cosmetologist who retires from the practice of
23	cosmetic art for not more than three years may renew his or her certificate of registration the
24	license issued by the Board upon payment of the required restoration fee, and by paying
25	the license fee for the years that such the license fees have not been paid.
26	(b) Every esthetician shall renew their license annually on or before October 1 of
27	each year. An esthetician teacher shall renew their license every two years on or before
28	October 1. As provided in G.S. 88-21, a late fee shall be charged for the renewal of the
29	license after that date. Any license not renewed shall expire on October 1 of that year.
30	(c) Prior to the renewal of an esthetician teacher's license, the teacher shall
31	annually complete a minimum of eight hours of continuing education which shall be
32	approved by the Board. Esthetician teachers shall submit written documentation to the
33	Board showing that they have satisfied the requirements of this subsection.
34	(d) If an apprentice, cosmetologist, esthetician, manicurist, or teacher fails to
35	renew their license within five years following the expiration date, the licensee shall be
36	required to pay the license fee for each year that the fees are delinquent and to pass an
37	examination as prescribed by the Board before the license will be reinstated.
38	(e) Every cosmetic art shop, which continues to operate, shall annually, on or
39 40	before February 1 of each year, renew its permit to operate, and any permit that has not
	been renewed before or during the month of February in any year shall expire on the first day of March in that year. A compatie art shop whose permit has expired may have its
41 42	day of March in that year. A cosmetic art shop whose permit has expired may have its permit restored immediately upon payment of restoration fee, as required in G.S. 88-21,
42 43	in addition to the renewal fee."
43	

Section 9. Any esthetician who submits proof to the Board that the esthetician 1 is actively engaged in the practice of esthetics on the effective date of this act and who 2 3 passes an examination conducted by the Board and pays the fee required by G.S. 88-4 21(a), as enacted in Section 1 of this act, shall be licensed without having to satisfy the requirements of G.S. 88-12.2, as enacted in Section 1 of this act. Persons who do not 5 6 make application to the Board within one year of the effective date of this act shall be required to complete all training and examination requirements prescribed by the Board 7 8 and to otherwise comply with the provisions of Chapter 88 of the General Statutes. 9

Section 10. This act becomes effective October 1, 1997.
