2 AN ACT TO ADOPT THE APPLE AS THE OFFICIAL STATE FRUIT.

Whereas, the apple is a nonfat, healthy fruit that provides the body with essential nutrients such as vitamins A and C and the mineral potassium; and

Whereas, apples may be served raw or cooked, may be eaten alone, or used as an ingredient in a number of recipes; and

Whereas, apple trees have a long life span and are able to bear fruit for many years; and Whereas, a variety of apples are grown in all three regions of the State of North Carolina; and

Whereas, apples are the leading fruit crop in the State; Now, therefore,

- 3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
 - Section 1. Chapter 145 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:
- 6 "<u>§ 145-18. State fruit.</u>

- The apple is adopted as the official fruit of the State of North Carolina."
