1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO
3	CONDUCT A TRUCKING SAFETY INTENSIVE ENFORCEMENT STUDY AND
4	TO REPORT THE RESULTS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. The Department of Transportation shall coordinate a study on the
7	effects of intensive enforcement of all trucking safety-related laws on a designated
8	portion of an interstate highway within this State.
9	Section 2. The Department of Transportation shall coordinate with the
10	following State agencies in determining the scope and duration of the intensive
11	enforcement action:
12	(1) The Division of Motor Vehicles, Enforcement Section.
13	(2) The Department of Crime Control and Public Safety, Highway Patrol
14	Division.
15	(3) The Governor's Highway Safety Program.
16	(4) The University of North Carolina, Highway Safety Research Center.
17	Section 3. As part of the intensive enforcement, traffic citations shall be issued
18	to drivers of trucks that exceed the speed limit. No warnings and no margins for error
19	shall be allowed for speeding violations.

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1	Section 4. Using funds already available, the Governor's Highway Safety
2	Program shall implement a public service campaign on trucking safety, including
3	encouraging the public to call "*HP"to report unsafe truck driving.
4	Section 5. The Division of Motor Vehicles and the Highway Patrol Division
5	shall compile statistics on all enforcement actions including:
6	(1) The number of trucks stopped and whether or not a citation or warning
7	was issued.
8	(2) Identifying characteristics of the drivers stopped, including the race or
9	ethnicity, approximate age, and gender.
10	(3) Any other information deemed to be necessary or relevant to determine
11	the effectiveness of the intensive enforcement of the trucking safety
12	laws.
13	Section 6. The costs of this study shall be borne by the Department of
14	Transportation from funds already available to that Department.
15	Section 7. The Department of Transportation shall report the results of this
16	study to the General Assembly by May 1, 1999.
17	Section 8. This act is effective when it becomes law.
